RELATED COMPROMISE
 Weeks ago, when it became apparent that there was serious competition of opinion, both in and out of Congress, on President Roosevelt's request for \$4,800,000,000 to be expended on works related in whatever way he saw fit, and when the difference of opinion crystallized around a compromise between the "prevailing wage" and the "prevailing wage plus 10 percent" wage of \$50 a month, the newspaper suggested that the only way out of the middle was a compromise. 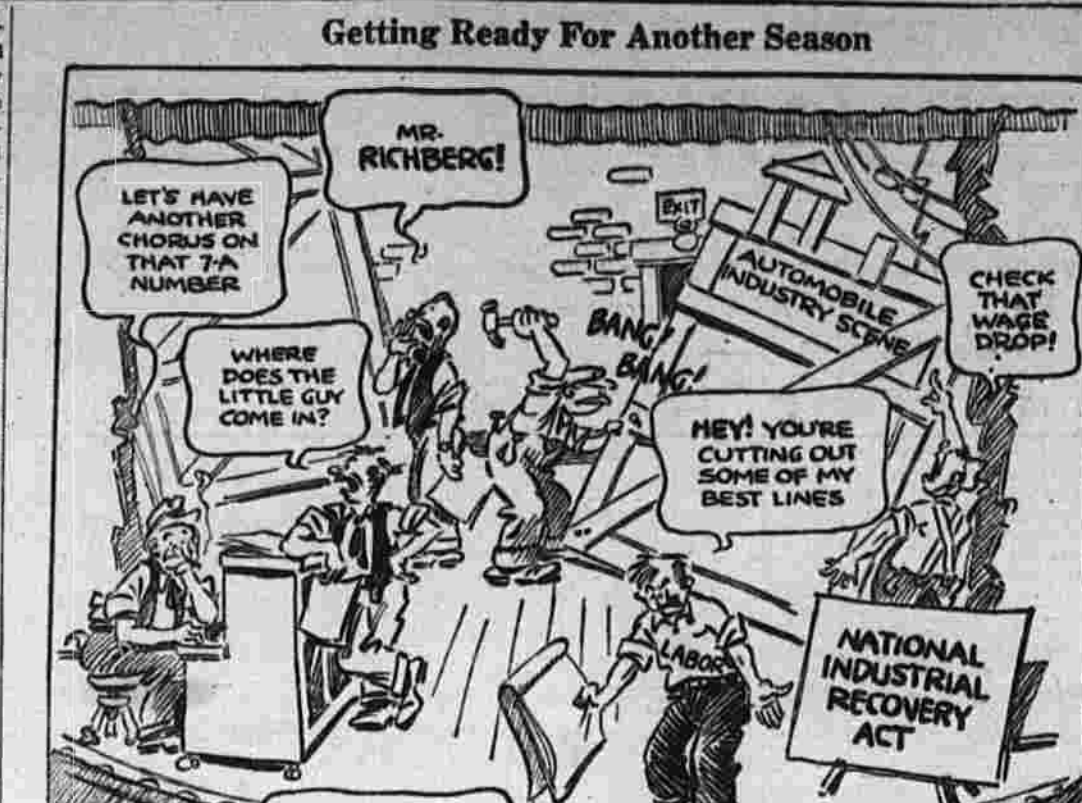

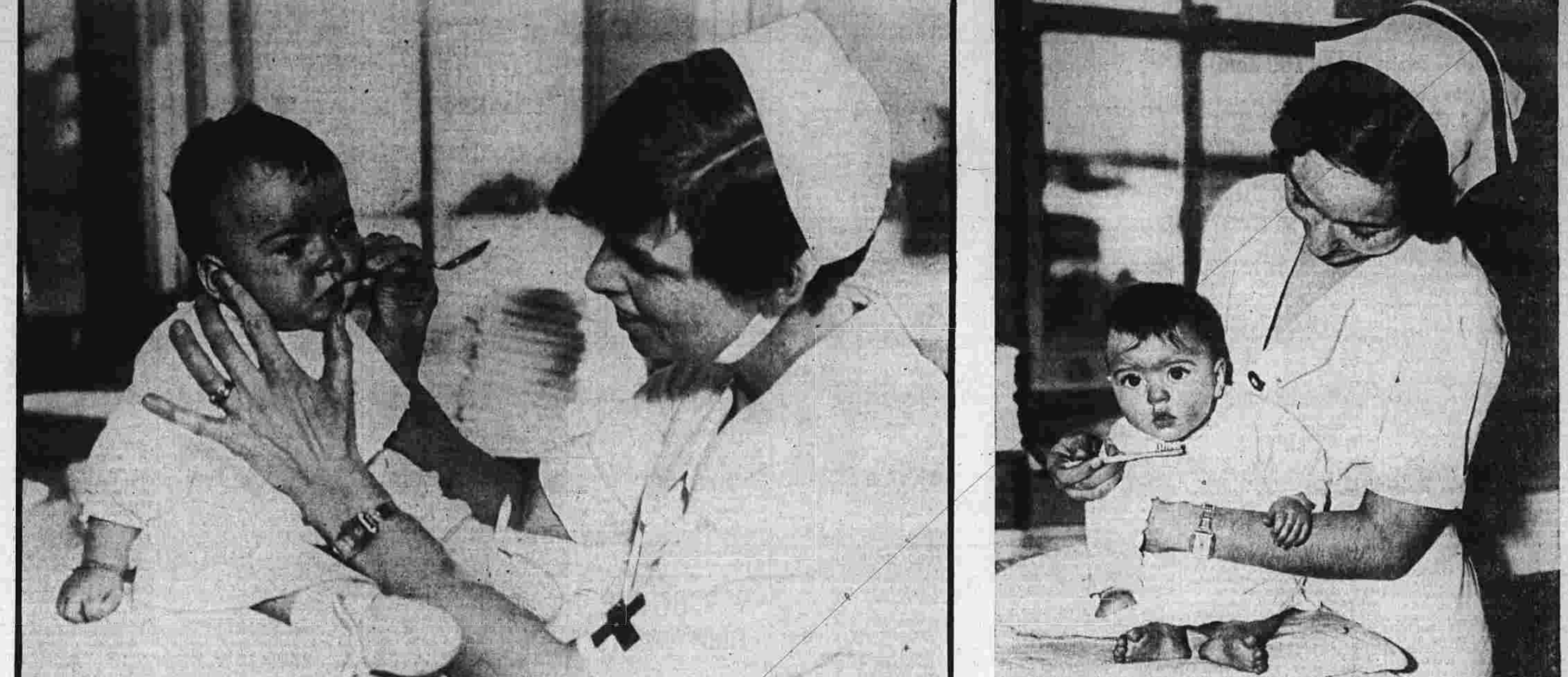
