SCIENCE MAKES GOOD PROGRESS WITH VACCINES

While most vaccines for the prevention of disease, with exception of those for smallpox, typhoid fever, diphtheria and rabies, have proved disappointing failures and have soon been discarded, nevertheless progress is being made toward the production of vaccines for other diseases and they may soon become available to alleviate human suffering, according to an article by Dr. Howard Knowlton, of the Bureau of Preventable Diseases of the Department of Health, which appears in the current issue of the department's monthly bulletin.

Today's experiments are being made with the most promising vaccine for whooping cough, one for scarlet fever, and another against paratyphoid, and with two modifying agents for measles. Dr. Knowlton said. Some of these preparations are on the market, but should only be used by a qualified physician, and his advice should be followed with reference to their use.
