

Recognition came to him slowly, but when it did come he was enthusiastically acclaimed by critics and public.

He received the Pulitzer prize in 1921 for his "Collected Poems;" in 1925 for "The Man Who Died Twice," and in 1927 for "Tristam," which became a best seller.

In 1922 Yale University awarded Robinson the degree of Doctor of Letters as the "Foremost Living Poet."

Critics often argued over Robinson's philosophy. Once a critic wrote


