



Rain Shortage.

Although Connecticut's surface water supplies in general are at present in good condition, with reservoirs and storage basins filled and overflowing their spillways, the ground water supply and the rate of stream flow despite the recent showery period are not on a par with their usual condition at this season of the year, a check-up of public water sources revealed to-

shortage in rainfall in every winte month with the exception of Janu-ary which had a precipitation con-siderably in excess (plus 1.86 inch-es) of the normal due to the heavy snowfall ir that month. In Decer ber and February, the precipitation was slightly below normal, while March proved an extraordinary dry month with a shortage in rain of 1.17 inches as compared with the normal. The excessive precipitation in January brought the total for the winter months within half on the of the normal for the feet. an inch of the normal for the four-month period. The succeeding de-cline in February and March, howand stream flow below average for this season. Although light rains have fallen intermittently for the past two weeks, precipitation in April is still lagging behind the normal for the month. Should the sub-normal rainfall continue through May, it would mean that the water supplies would

approach the ordinarily dry sum-mer months facing possible low levels, since, with a depleted ground water supply, stream flow would dwindle to a minimum and no fresh voirs. Even in such an event, ther in the water supply in Connect have been constantly enlarging and improving their shortage systems to impound sufficient water in seaquirements of the dry periods.

During the past ten years, the capacity of Connecticut's water works systems has been increased to be per cent, or from a capacity of 39 billion gallons in 1925 to 60 billion gallons in 1934. This growth has come both from the constru tion of new reservoirs, standpipes, and storage tanks, and from the expansion of older facilities by such means as raising the height of dams so as to impound more water. All of this increased capacity has been developed in the past ten years by privately operated companies which more than doubled the capanotable development of the decade was the 13-billion-gallon North Branford development of the New largest reservoir in Connecticut.






