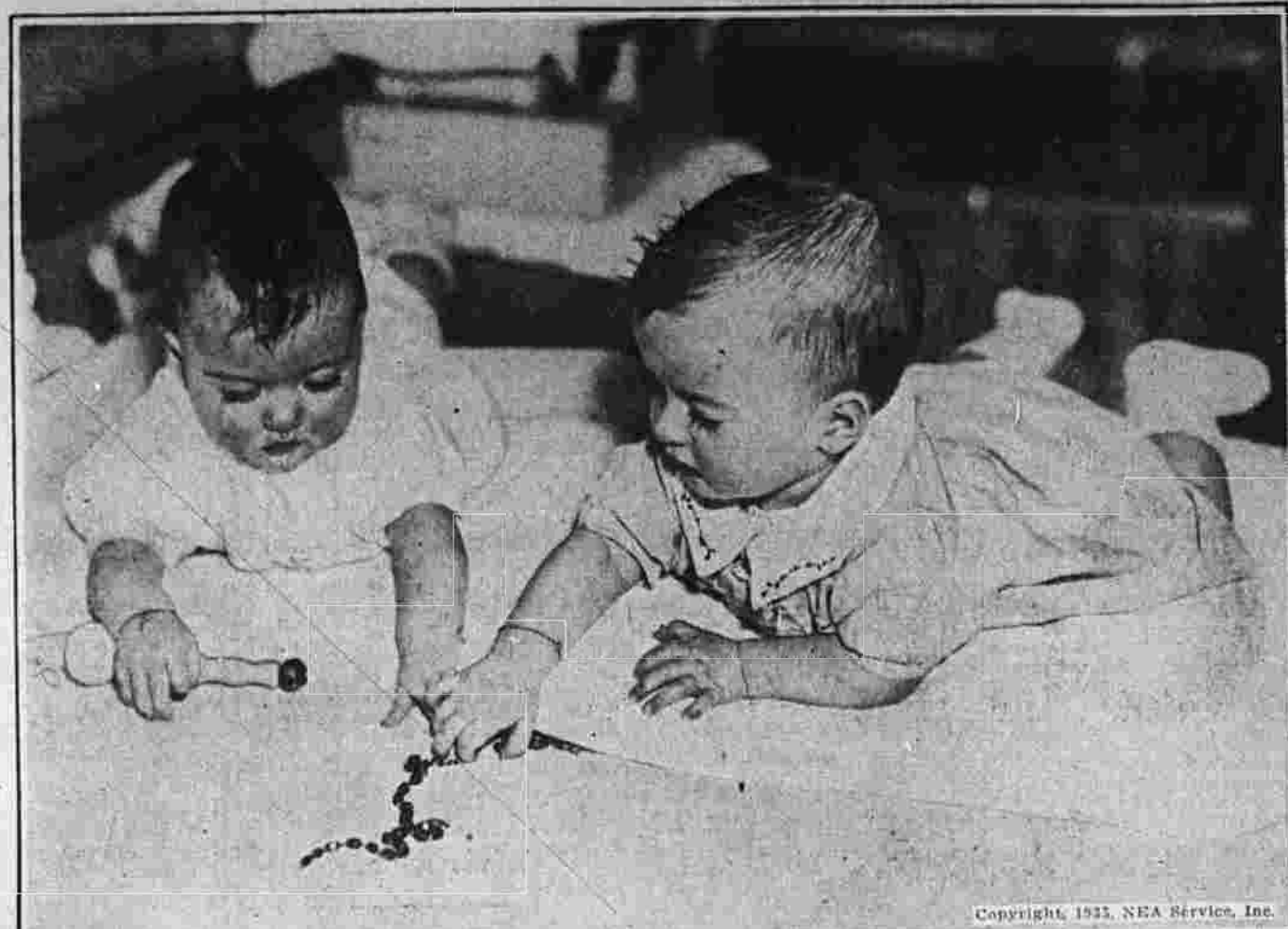

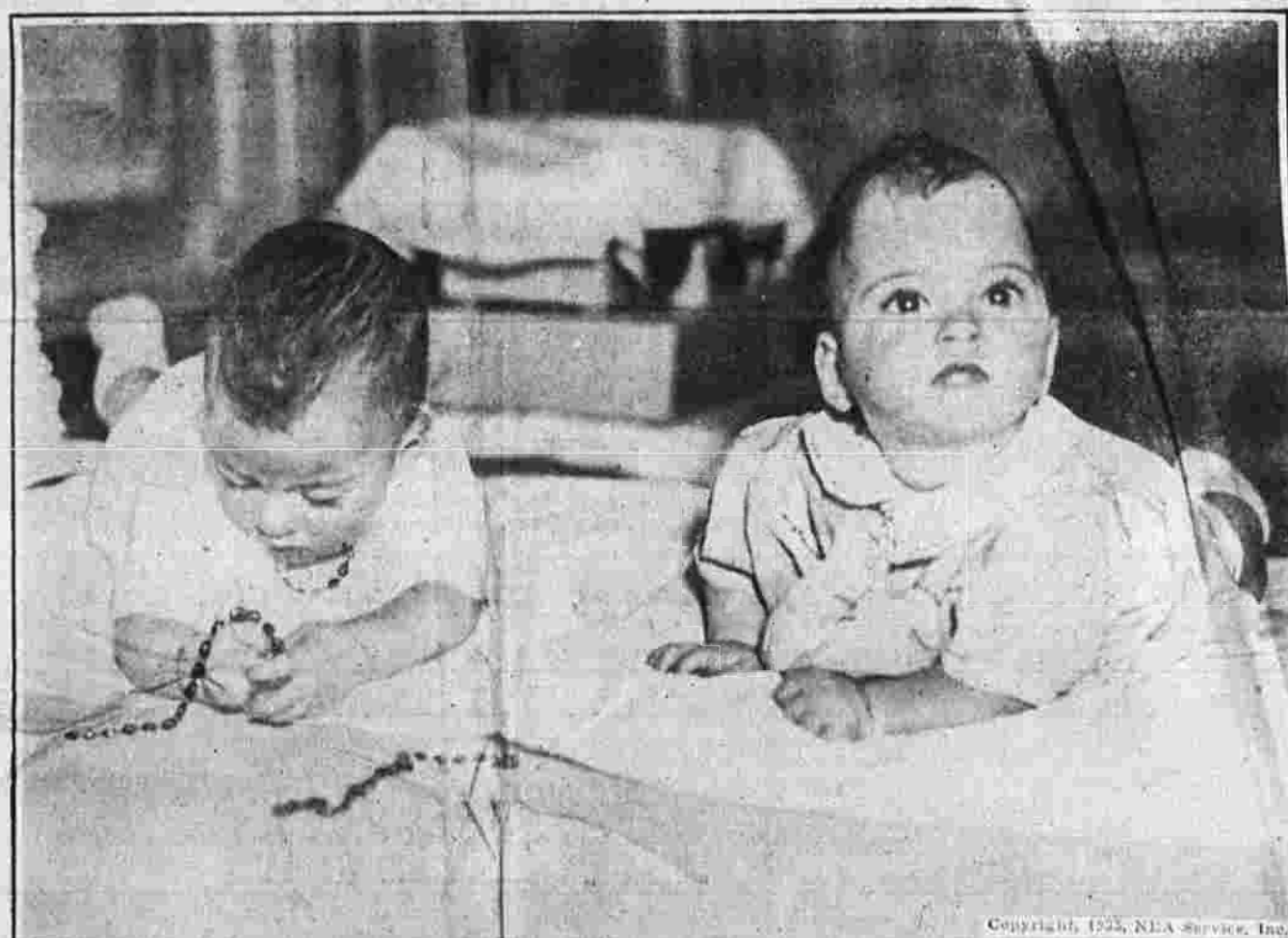

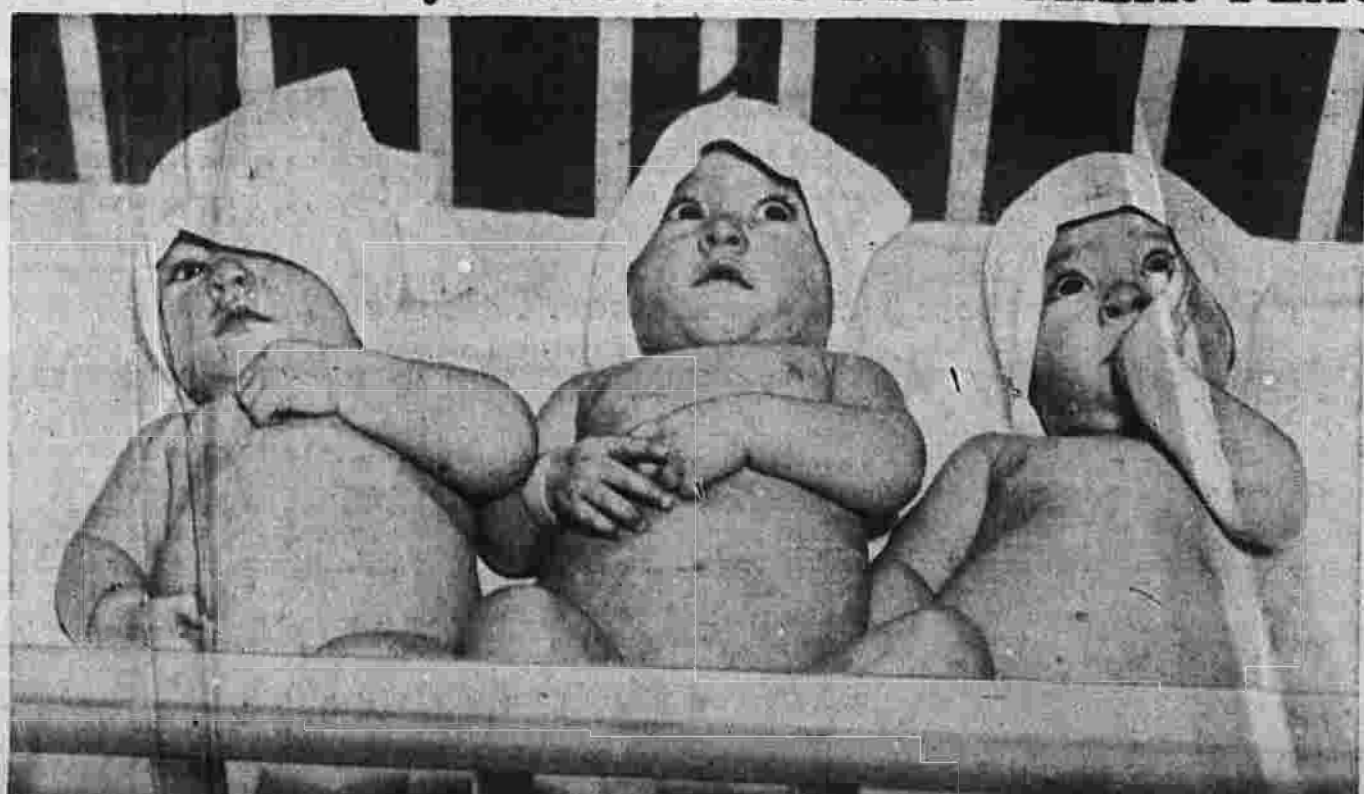


Act 4
