Would Saddle The Town With Additional Taxes
The pressing financial problems created by the depression have added heavily to the cost of local government everywhere. Manchester is no exception to this burdensome condition. The constant drain on the limited tax resources of the town due to the unemployment situation, the increased scope of governmental services, and the gradual drying-up of the tax base in industry, have put an effective barrier in the way of tax relief locally.

There is no assurance that these needs will diminish in the near future. In addition taxpayers are confronted with the prospect of additional taxes to meet the increased cost of the municipal government. It is estimated that the town will be forced into the added expense of a special election which invites the voters to decide additional interest-bearing indebtedness on the taxpayers under the heading of municipal ownership of the local electric light business.

It is submitted that such a questionable enterprise would constitute the quickest and most effective way for the taxpayers of Manchester to get rid of the tax burden.
