



Big Dust Storm

Hits Manchester of dust kicked up by the Manchester Electric Company and others in a frantic effort to make the intelligent voters and taxpayers of Manchester believe that it would be a dire calamity if the town

should go into the electric business and deprive the local electric company of its gold mine.

Take the argument about the loss in taxes which the town would stand if it took over the electric business. To be sure, the town "lost" about \$12,000 in taxes when it assumed control of the water and sewer properties from Cheney Brothers. However, the statement of the Manchester water and sewer departments for the year ending December 31, 1934, shows a balance to the credit of \$26,000 for the town as a whole. If the town had not pur-chased the water and sewer properties, it would have received \$12,000 in taxes last year; instead there is a balance to the credit of these utilities of \$38,000. Is that a good or bad proposition? So much for that cloud of dust.

Another dust spasm on the matter is the one about how a municipal electric department would impose an additional tax burden. This is entirely false. The water department which the town assumed a year and a half ago has been entirely self-sup-porting from its own income. It has paid all interest charges due on its bonds and has made provision for bond payments com-ing due, besides paying all of its operating expenses. The taxpayers very likely will never be called on to support the water of an electric department, only more so. As time goes on and the fixed charges grow less, our utilities departments ought to make up to the town much more than the town would lose in

utility bonds from the 5% borrowing capacity limit of municipalities. All the dust kicked up on this point is in vain, because of the above legal provision. The town could buy up every utility in sight and pay for them through the sale of bonds, and all on the town's borrowing capacity.

People ought to wear protective glasses when reading such dusty stuff as has appeared on this subject in the paper lately. The best way to make this unprecedented dust storm subside is to vote "YES" in the election on May 15.
