SENATORS MERRITT DISCUSS HIGHWAY

Republican Floor Leader to Present Bill to Speed Up Work—Suggests a Bond Issue.

State Capitol, Hartford, May 8.—(AP)—A more looking toward the speeding up of the construction of the Merritt highway was disclosed today by Senator J. Kenneth Brad...

It is estimated that about \$1,000,000 a year will be received from the state highway fund, this amount to go annually to retirement of the county bonds. The entire issue under Bradley's plan, would be retired with 15 years.

Senator J. Sedgwick Tracy, Republican chairman of the Finance committee, said in commenting on the proposal: "Of course we (the committee) haven't discussed it, but I don't see any objection to it."

Accepting the committee report, the Senate rejected the bill together with one appropriating \$15,000 for printing the roster of Connecticut men and women who served in the armed forces or as nurses during the World War.

The financial responsibility bill carried an appropriation of \$5,000. It proposed the creation of a commission comprising a Superior Court judge, the state motor vehicle and insurance commissioner and two citizens.

Senator Kenneth F. Cramer, Republican chairman of the Appropriations committee told the Senate that considerable data on the question of financial responsibility already was in the possession of the Motor Vehicle Commissioner. Cramer told the Senate he regretted having to report unfavorably the roster bill, but felt impelled to do so because of the expenditure it would involve to carry out the proposal.

Legal experts in legislative circles expressed the opinion that if the Attorney General issues no action on pending bills, the incumbent will continue in office as a de facto judge until May 15.

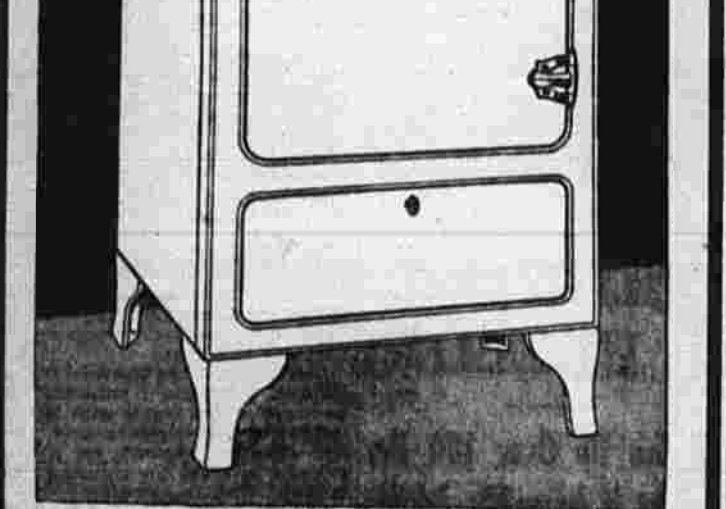
