Dairy Experts Agree That They Can Replace Reindeer in Cold Countries.

New Brunswick, N. J., May 15.—(AP)—The reindeer milk monopoly in the Arctic region is being challenged by a chance to give muskoxen on the territory, state dairy experts decided today.

They had just finished examinations of two dairy animals brought back from Little America by the Byrd Antarctic expedition, and the verdict was that cows could supplant the reindeer as a milk source without much trouble.

The two animals, both purchased in Norway, were Eoberg, a bull born 17 months ago in Little America, and Foremost Southern Cross, a yearling cow, that supplied the Byrd party with milk for the last 15 months.

Dr. J. W. Bartlett, professor of dairying at the New Jersey College of Agriculture, said both animals were in perfect health and in almost show ring condition. He expects recovery.

The Byrd expedition, he declared, has proved that a vigorous, purchased dairy cow can produce large quantities of milk, and reproduce herself in the coldest of climates. It has demonstrated, moreover, that people in Arctic zones may not have to depend on the less productive reindeer for their fresh milk.

The animals were brought here by the Byrd party returning on the ship, they were loaded on another truck and taken to New York City before the American Gurney Cart club.

30 MILLIONS IN GOLD FROM FRANCE TO U. S.

World Now Heavily Buying Dollars to Meet Commercial Obligations, It Belief.

Paris, May 15.—(AP)—Heavy shipments of gold, estimated at between \$27,000,000 and \$30,000,000 in value, have been sent to the United States from France during the past week, it was disclosed today.

With the dollar fluctuating around the gold export point, shipments have been made on fast boats, the government beginning May 11 on the Europe.

The Europe carried about \$12,000,000 in gold, the majority today being \$10,000,000 while there was at least \$2,000,000 aboard the Champlain, delayed by a crew strike at Le Havre.

Banking experts said the draft on the Bank of France could easily be absorbed as gold is constantly coming from Switzerland and other European countries, making up the losses to a considerable extent.
