SENATE DEADLOCK ON TAX UNBROKEN
Jam Remains Despite Causes of Three Parties; Four Measures Favored.

State Capitol, Hartford, May 17.—(AP)—A single administrator and two deputies would replace the present board of three milk control commissioners under a Milk Control bill proposed today by the Agricultural Experiment Station.

The bill, sponsored by the Special Tax Study Commission was reported by the Finance Committee on the heels of a Democratic-Socialist demand that show its name on the best of the taxation program before Senate consideration of the Sales Tax.

Three of the four measures which name the Milk Control Commission on cigarettes, miscellaneous corporations and premiums collected by insurance companies while the fourth revised the law on unincorporated business so that they may require reports of milk bought and sold and the prices paid and received on each transaction.

20 MORE KILLED IN RED UPRISING
Band of Filipino Communists Defeated in Battle With Government Forces.

Manila, May 17.—(AP)—Twenty more names were reported added today to a growing death list from extremists in the Philippines, which this week took a major step toward independence from the United States.

La Vanguardia, Spanish newspaper, and two members of a roaming band of 250 communists were killed in a battle with government forces for the slaying of a municipal official of the village of San Antonio in La Cuna province.

The paper quoted a soldier who returned to San Antonio with a prisoner. He told of a pitched battle between 250 well equipped communist soldiers and 300 poorly armed men dressed in red uniforms.

PLAN EXTRA DAYS FOR LEGISLATORS
Will Also Be Compelled To Work on Memorial Day to Finish Business.

State Capitol, Hartford, May 17.—(AP)—Senator J. Kenneth Bradley, Republican floor leader, served notice to the Senate today that beginning May 25, he may become necessary to hold sessions of the General Assembly on Mondays and Saturdays.

Because of the present legislative day, the Republican floor leader asks that the Legislature be kept in session on Memorial Day.

Under the tentative work program mapped out by Bradley, the General Assembly would report on Saturdays, May 25 and June 1, and on Mondays, May 27 and June 3, for overtime work.

Under the State Constitution the General Assembly must finish its business June 5. Between then and now it must decide such issues as taxes, milk, liquor, the state budget and minor judgeships.
