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any or jobs in the law, would rather revolutionize the monetary and credit system of the nation and break the grip of private control on the throat of industry, business and agriculture. And just as casually President Roosevelt, with every appearance of complete frankness, told the congressional correspondents that he thought the change proposed by Mr. Morgenthau would "solve many of our difficulties" and "retain the best of the old" that should have been done long ago.

The thing proposed is the purchase by the government of all the stock of the Federal Reserve Banks, thus making the government, and not the private owners of those banks the actual controller of the money and credit system. Not only the abolition of check clearing has such a tremendously revolutionary proposal been advanced by any administration. And yet it is passed into the hands of the people. It involved nothing more than a mere detail of a government policy already well recognized.

The full potential importance of the action of Mr. Morgenthau and Mr. Roosevelt has probably not yet been realized by one per cent of the people of the country. And this is the case with the other proposals which are being advanced in the present Congress.

CIGARETTE TAX

The very evident determination of the present Congress to increase the General Assembly to avoid, if they can do so by any possible device, placing any substantial part of the tax on the cigarette, has led to the strange and devious path. First they proposed to raise practically all the new cigarette tax on the tax bearing with complete ruthlessness upon the meager nutriment of the jobless as well as upon the income of the worker. Then they proposed to put a tax on the cigarette, but to be able, no doubt, to put over a general sales tax, food alone exempted, which is without merit on any other basis than that of simplicity and ease of collection.

Directly in line with this slovenly and unfair kind of tax imposition is the proposed impost of two cents a package on cigarettes—than which there is no more discredited taxing device anywhere. Already every package of cigarettes is taxed at the rate of six cents per pack. The government takes six cents, the tobacco grower and the manufacturer take 4.75 cents, the wholesaler and the retailer divide the tiny remainder.

And now it is proposed to pile another two-cent levy on top of the excessive taxation in the form of a state tax.

It is not only utterly unjust but it is sure to prove disastrous to the effect. It is a demonstrable fact that in states where a local tax is imposed on cigarettes the sales fall to less than half per capita, and in the states where there is no local tax, cigarette smokers simply buy their cigarettes outside the state. There is no legal way of preventing the purchaser from having his supplies sent in from other states by mail or by express, and the common device of "tolling their own."

The cigarette smoker in the present position to him, the taxpayer in the country already, if he smokes one package a day he is to smoke into the federal treasury for the price of the cigarette, fully aware that he has been made a tax goat and he is not likely to stand for any more amplification of that status through a state tax. He will do it if he can—and he can. He can go back to the wartime practice of making his own bags, he can drive over the state line and bring back half a dozen cartons at a time, he can buy them from mail orders, he can take them to his door.

That is what smokers have done to a tremendous extent in every state that has adopted a cigarette tax, with the result that the incomes unimpacted from such taxes have shrunk in actual collections to one-fourth or less.

We make no claim that the proposed tax on cigarettes is inherently immoral, wicked, like the one on food; but it is a foolish tax, because it will never produce the expected income; it is an unfair tax, because it adds to the tax burden of a class already very heavily taxed; it is an unjust tax because it will drive a large amount of business away from Connecticut retailers and into the hands of retailers in neighboring states and in the mail-order centers. If it is adopted, it should not be.

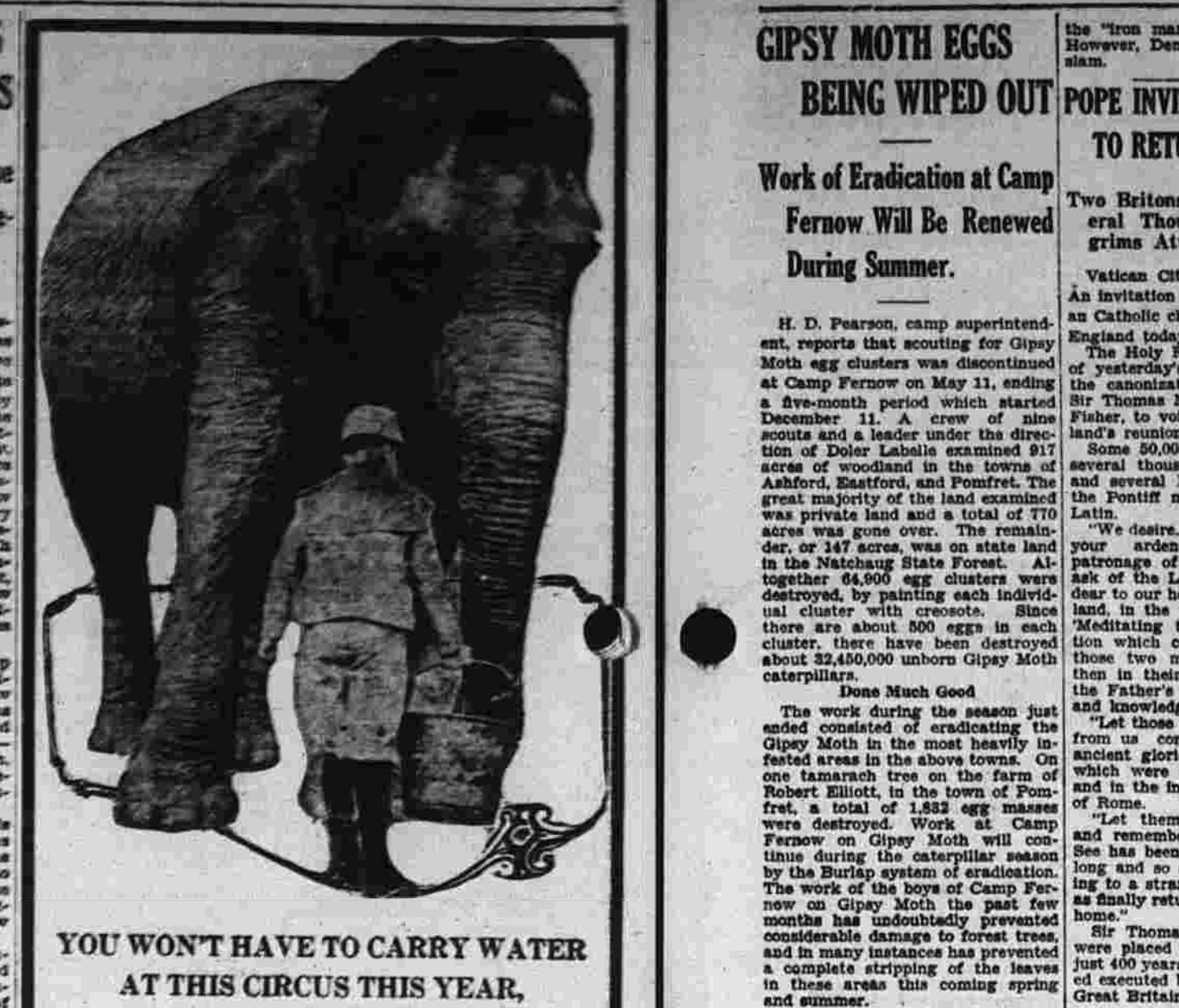

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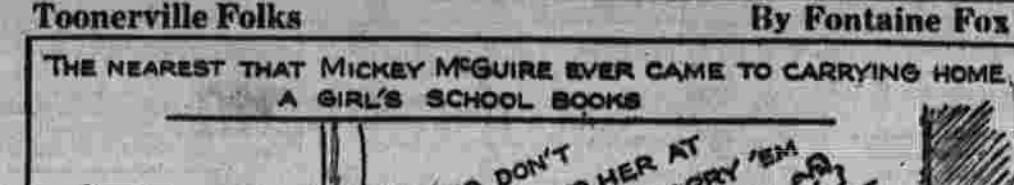
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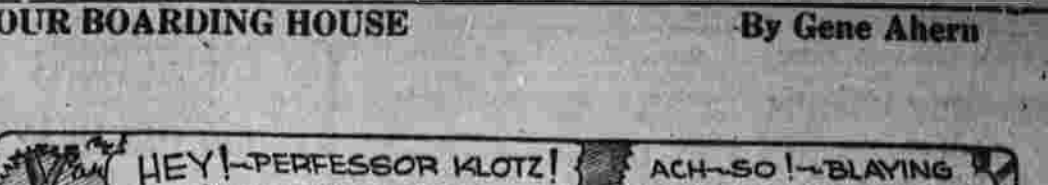
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
