HOUSE TO TACKLE LIQUOR BILL TODAY

Faces Long Session to Debate Controversial Measure; Merritt Parkway and Billboard Bills Approved.

State Capitol, Hartford, May 31.—(AP)—In rapid fire succession the general assembly packed today a group of major bills, including the Merritt Parkway and Billboard measures and the Senate passing a bill increasing the personnel of the State Police Department.

The House rushed through the Merritt Parkway and Billboard bills under suspension of the rules and recessed preparatory to tackling the liquor bill which was approved by the Senate shortly thereafter.

Also facing a long session that promised to go at least until early evening, the Senate likewise recessed after approving the State Police Department bill.

Legislative leaders planned to complete legislative action on the three major bills during the afternoon.

Debate on the billboard measure was shut off by a motion on the previous question, after Representative Estill of Salisbury tried to get a House for lunch before tackling the measure.

The bill was placed on the House calendar earlier in the week over the objection of a majority report by Mr. Cheney.

Many endorsements of the measure had been secured in the House by Representatives Helen B. Kitchel of Greenwich, two years ago the House approved a similar measure, which, however, failed to win Senate approval.

The bill requires an annual licensing of \$100 to engage in outdoor advertising and sets up a graduated scale of permits for billboards as follows: 100 square feet or less, advertising signs, \$5; 200 to 500 square feet, \$10; 500 to 1,000 square feet, \$15; 1,000 to 2,000 square feet, \$20; 2,000 to 3,000 square feet, \$25; 3,000 to 4,000 square feet, \$30; 4,000 to 5,000 square feet, \$35; 5,000 to 6,000 square feet, \$40; 6,000 to 7,000 square feet, \$45; 7,000 to 8,000 square feet, \$50; 8,000 to 9,000 square feet, \$55; 9,000 to 10,
