 (Question: Mr. Harold A. writes: "I am having quite a struggle with constipation. When I use a strong cathartic I feel that my colitis returns. Should I discontinue the laxative? When I do I notice I get a bad headache and my tongue becomes coated. Some of the time my stomach seems upset no matter what I eat and I am troubled by gas.")
 Answer: All of the symptoms you mention are common in chronic constipation. I advise that the patient with colitis avoid laxatives as they may tend to increase the irritation in the intestine. I suggest that instead you try using the enema. As a general rule the enema secures results satisfactory in every way and the enema may be continued until the inflammation of the colon is relieved. The enema will clean the intestine sufficiently so that your headache, coated tongue and flatulence will be alleviated. The safest rule for you to follow is to eat as usual, but to use the enema daily.
