In chronic rhinitis, the mucous membrane of the nose becomes inflammed and swollen and there is an increased secretion of mucus, as the result of continued irritation. Ordinarily chronic catarrh develops only after many colds.

In this disorder, the blood vessels become distended or stretched with an associated softening of their walls. The membrane may thicken or harden. The nose feels stopped up or obstructed and the amount of nucus secreted is greatly increased.

A dull headache may develop but the boring persistent headache as seen in sinus trouble is not present and the patient describes rather a dull distress or heavy sensation.

When the patient goes to bed at night, the side of the nose next to the pillow becomes clogged up so that he cannot breathe through it. Sometimes the patient says that the inside of the nose feels dry. At times, he notices that the hearing is dull. In making a diagnosis of chronic rhinitis, a local examination of the nose is necessary and the information gained in this way, together with a consideration of the patient's symptoms, will tell what its wrong.






