China Leans On Chiang In Crisis

China Seeking Aid of Powers Against Japan

Nippon Massing Troops Along Great Wall as Tension Grows; Britain Adopts Watchful Waiting Attitude

London, June 15.—(AP)—China's "last hope"—an appeal to the western powers for help—created deep concern today as Japan was reported massing troops along the Great Wall for an advance on Peiping.

The Chinese ambassador, Quo Tsiang, visited the Foreign Office yesterday and discussed the Sino-Japanese crisis with the British foreign secretary, Anthony Eden.

The face of the charge, a proclamation of the policy of the new foreign secretary, Lord Halifax, was awaited anxiously.

While no official comment was immediately forthcoming, it was understood that Great Britain would maintain the attitude of "watchful waiting," at least pending an exchange of views with other signatories of the League of Nations.

The Times pointed out that under the terms of the pact, the United States, Belgium, Great Britain, France, Italy, Japan, the Netherlands and Portugal agreed to "re-assert the sovereignty, independence, territorial and administrative integrity of China."

The newspaper asserts that the Chinese government was complaining of "recent actions of Japanese military authorities in a breach of the treaty."

British Pledge "You should take a little interest in what Japan is doing," the Express said, "British lives are pledged by the nine-power treaty to defend the territorial integrity of China."

"They were pledged by the treaty of 1915 to carry out their obligations to carry their program in the North China districts."

In a reply which some observers termed "mild" but others described as a challenge to Calles, Cardenas asserted he was in no way responsible for political divisions and said he regarded strikes as a necessary weapon when the interests of labor and within the possibilities of capitalism.
