BUILD HUGE TANK FOR HYGRADE OIL

Capacity of Rocky Hill Plant Will Be Seven Million Gallons When Finished.

With construction starting on a 2,000,000-gallon tank in Rocky Hill, the Hygrade Oil Company, Inc., has added to the 4,000,000-gallon tanks capacity already there. The new tank will have a bulk oil capacity of 7,000,000 gallons, thereby becoming the largest independent plant of its kind in New England, outside of Boston. It has been announced at company headquarters, 25 Charter Oak avenue.

Additional plants, housing about 800,000 gallons, will also be established in Manchester and Bristol. Harry Levitt, president of Hygrade, will personally take charge of the actual construction. Less than four years ago, when Hygrade took over the distribution of Richmond gasoline, the company was selling less than a quarter million gallons of gasoline a year. During the last four years, Hygrade has boosted the number of gallons sold a great many times over.

Pay \$112,000 Gasoline Tax. At present Hygrade pays the largest gasoline tax—\$112,000—of any company operating in Connecticut, with the exception of the major corporations. Fuel oil is not included in this tax.

During this same period of four years there has been a growth from 22 to 33 company-owned and controlled service stations and 150 dealers distributing both Richmond and Hygrade petroleum in Connecticut and Massachusetts. Hygrade handles gasoline, motor oils, kerosene, fuel oils, solvents for cleaning and alcohol.

It was in 1927 that two men first started the Hygrade Oil Company, pooling their entire resources. A part-time bookkeeper was added to the staff. As business developed a 40,000-gallon bulk plant was required and rapidly grew to 2,000,000 gallons.

More sales men were placed on the contact staff, new trucks and drivers were added and the company extended its operations to three controlled gasoline stations and six dealer stations. It was in 1931 that the company started selling Hygrade and Richmond gasolines. The company now employs 150 persons, operating the 15 stations mentioned above and distributing also through the 150 dealers.

Extent of Territory. The Hygrade Oil Company's operations through its own gasoline stations includes territories in Hartford, West Hartford, East Hartford, Bristol, Manchester, New Britain, Norwich, New London and other other towns and cities.

With the inception of the National Recovery Act, the Hygrade Oil Company was among the first to sign the president's agreement and increased its staff more than 25 per cent. During the past year the company has consistently tried to place more men at work. Building operations, new stations and other enterprises have kept scores of men constantly in the employ of the firm.

Last winter when heavy snows and distributors faced big transportation problems, Hygrade maintained its open service. Every contracted customer found his supply delivered on time, and others who faced the last "famine," called Hygrade in for aid.

In addition, consumers also sought assistance from Hygrade, and the company turned to and brought fuel aid to hundreds of homes. So successful was this phase of business that Hygrade will go into consumer trade permanently this year.

Certified Gasoline Well Known. Where a few years ago Hygrade certified gasoline was generally unknown, today it is well known to all motorists. Certified Hygrade petroleum meets standards that are far above government specifications for motor operation as it has done from the outset. The company is alert to the motorist's needs and demands of motorists and is continually increasing its products with every scientific innovation brought out by petroleum research chemists.

Some of the reasons which the company attributes its success are these: Hygrade is independently owned; its products are above United States standards; it employs local people; deals locally, builds and pays taxes locally; it gives personal contact to its automobile owners; its low overhead gives the customer better price advantages.

Hygrade Oil Company drivers who have perfect records for three months receive bonuses for their achievements. Seventy-five employees of the company controlled stations work on a profit sharing basis and everyone carries group insurance.

While the Hygrade Oil Company has its main office at 22 Charter Oak avenue, Hartford, the bulk plant with millions of gallons of petroleum is located in Rocky Hill along the Connecticut river. Here at this bulk plant, the company maintains garages, warehousing equipment for 20 carloads of motor oils, solvents, anti-freeze, alcohol and soft soaps and huge tanks for storage of Hygrade and Richmond gasoline of all grades. The new tank of 2,000,000-gallon capacity will be used for the storage of fuel oils and other tanks already on the land will contain various types of fuel for heating, including kerosene, fuel oils, No. 1, 2, 3, and 4. Last year a large pier was erected on the Connecticut river allowing barges with a half-million oil capacity to dock at the Hygrade Oil Company plant.

The company's plan of sharing profits with service station men in controlled stations have proved effective during the past two years for in many cases men have earned many hundreds of dollars. Contests are frequently held in which prize money is awarded and monthly meetings make the sales policy of the company effective.

TRADERS CAUTIOUS IN TODAY'S MARKET

Grains and Cotton in Rally; Bonds Mixed During Early Hours.

New York, June 18.—(AP)—The Stock Market groped for higher levels today but bullish forces were more than ordinarily cautious and buying continued highly selective. Many traders stood aside on the theory that some sort of a technical reaction was due. At the same time sellers were extremely timid. The plethora of tie funds was still seen as the principal supporting influence for equities.

Grains rallied as heavy rains were believed to be delaying harvest. Cotton also improved. Bonds were somewhat mixed. The French franc was firm in foreign exchange dealings, reflecting further optimism over the recent aid given this currency by the United States Treasury.

The activity in stocks was not pronounced. Advances of fractions to a point or more, however, were registered by Johns-Manville, American Can, Du Pont, American Tobacco, T. B. Hayes Cigar, Radio Preferred, T. American Telephone, May Robson, at Bayview, Queens, New Jersey, Macy, J. C. Penney, Woolworth, Union Pacific, Southern Pacific and N. Y. Central.

The steel, motor, chemical and metal markets were unchanged to a shade higher or lower. The mining group was listless in the face of reports that the Senate

committee was expected to sustain this action later in the week. The hunt for income, even of the most meager sort, was exemplified by announcement that the \$228,000,000 consolidated 3 per cent. bond issue of the Federal land banks, offered today, had been heavily oversubscribed and the books closed within a few minutes after they were opened.

Latest freight car loadings statements indicated traffic was more than holding its own. Brokers said that industrial specialties with earnings potentials were being picked up quietly by careful purchasers.

MAY ROBSON ON HOLIDAY. New York, June 18.—(AP)—May Robson, "Mother" character player of motion pictures, arrived here today in the liner Santa Elena from California for a visit with three generations of her descendants. She will stay with her son, grandson and great-granddaughter, 10-month-old Miss Robson mentioned Greta Garbo as one of her entertainers. During their association in a film she said Miss Garbo became "her child" and obeyed her counsel to eat liver to make herself stronger.

The elderly actress is on a six weeks holiday.

GOV. CROSS SIGNS BRIDGE MEASURE

Provides for Immediate Construction of Bridge from Portland to Middletown.

Hartford, June 18.—(AP)—Governor Cross has signed the bill providing for the immediate construction of a bridge between Middletown and Portland, and authorizing

the county of Middlesex to borrow not to exceed \$3,500,000 in bonds, one-fifth of each issue of bonds to be repaid annually from funds of the State Highway Department.

Other public acts signed follow: Concerning the establishment of prevailing rates of wages on road and bridge work by the state; concerning town boards of education; concerning members of the Mill Regulation board; concerning treatment of patients suffering from venereal diseases in hospitals receiving state aid; concerning interest penalty on delinquent taxes; concerning peddlers, junk dealers and itinerant vendors; concerning registration, operation and transfer of ownership of motor vehicles; concerning revocation of license by the milk administrator; concerning publication of annual rate of interest of small loan companies; pre-

vention of sale of inferior drugs, cosmetics and merchandise; concerning certificate for employment of minors; concerning a temporary cigarette tax and concerning the committee on appropriations and appropriation bills.

Meaning of Measure. The bill referring to the committee on appropriations simply makes it unnecessary for the Board of Control to set with the appropriations committee something that has been disregarded for several seasons except that the committee of finance has always met with the appropriations committee.

The temporary cigarette tax is one of the revenue producing measures recommended by the Finance committee, passed during the closing days of the session, and concerning which much was said at the legislative sessions.

Among the special acts signed by the governor were the following: Creating a commission on the im-

provement of accounts in the hall of the House of Representatives; authorizing the establishment of state police barracks at Colchester; authorizing the town of West Hartford to give a pension to Benjamin F. Alger from the date of his retirement October 1, 1933; making an appropriation of \$135,000 for the purchase of a state park at Sherwood Island; creating a commission on interstate compact affecting labor and industry; authorizing the city of Hartford to establish a retirement system for city employees; authorizing the city of Bridgeport to issue Hartford street extension obligations; and appropriating \$28,000 for the State Department of Labor and Factory Inspection for maintenance of employment office.
