CODE OF OPINIONS

Although the actual work of the attorney general's office under Warren Burrows was concluded on January 1 last, some of the work that was inaugurated by his staff is going on under supervision.

Important among these carried-over functions is the activity of Ernest W. Averill of Bradford, for many years a figure in state politics, who as president of the National Association of Attorneys General, maintains a lively interest in the matters that attract the attention of the legal representatives of the nation's commonwealths.

Mr. Averill attained prominence among attorney generals of the country through his efficient presentation of cases before the Supreme Court in behalf of the State of Connecticut, but his most important work, and that which won him the presidency of the national association, was his insistence upon a compilation of opinions rendered by attorney generals in every state in the union and dating back over a period of years.

The importance of such a codification can be realized best when one understands the legal procedure which an attorney general works. Nearly all of the large corporations, the utility companies, the insurance companies, the railroad companies and the various large industrial concerns, who, at one time or another, must go to suit against the attorney general to enforce some law, or the treatment of a particular case that has no precedent, have powerful legal departments in their employ. These departments of various private firms have made special studies of opinions rendered that affect their particular industries.

When going before an attorney general they may refer to this opinion rendered in that state, and as an oftentimes to the embarrassment of the attorney general, who has no means of obtaining the information, and, therefore, can scarcely judge the content of the opposing attorney.

For example, the insurance companies in Connecticut may be seeking an opinion on or a clarification of some new legislation affecting their practice. Having made an extensive study of all such opinions rendered in every state in the country, the legal departments of these companies have at their command any findings that may touch upon the case in point. They lay their case, or a summarization of findings that touch the particular case, before the attorney general. He may either delay the proceedings in order to ascertain if these findings have been made and if they may have later been contradicted.

Possession of a compilation of these findings would save the attorney general's problem, and he would be able to study the case on an even footing with the attorney who has been especially trained and equipped in one particular line.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

(Pain in Back Caused by Strain) Question: "I write: Several years ago I was in a sudden 'crack' in the last joint of the back which caused me to go to a doctor to find out how to get it better. I was told that it was a strain and that I should rest and use heat. I did so for several weeks but the pain did not go away. I am now 65 years old and the pain is still there. I am unable to do any work and I am in great pain. Please advise me what to do." Answer: "The pain in your back is probably due to a strain of the muscles of the back. This is a common condition and is usually caused by lifting or carrying heavy objects, or by sudden movements of the body. The pain is usually relieved by rest and heat, but if it persists, it may be necessary to use other measures. I would advise you to see a doctor who can examine you and give you a more definite diagnosis. In the meantime, you should continue to use heat and rest, and avoid any activities that may aggravate the pain. If the pain is severe, you may wish to try some of the following remedies: 1. Washington, June 19.—The Senate Judiciary Committee found him guilty of no worse crime than youth.
