### OPEN FORUM

#### TO THE MAN WHO HOLDS TWO JOBS

Mr. Editor: We are really sorry to have to annoy you again, but please allow us enough space to answer this "man who holds two jobs," and knows so much about the American language and estate laws. We did not intend to open a debate with him when we answered Mr. Currier's letter, but we do think it is our duty as a public Association, to defend ourselves against his stabs and accusations.

Now, Mr. Hildebrand, don't you think your statement to the public was pretty broad, when you said they should visit a doctor, and that 25 cents for a hair cut was enough. We think you stumbled there and we also think that 25 cents is too much to pay to a man, who is holding down two jobs. It certainly would be impossible for you to join our Association. The truth is, as you will be surprised to know, that none of our Association gave many haircuts to the strikers, but they did not tell the world about it. Nor did we do it as a publicity stunt.

Yes, Mr. Hildebrand we agree with you about the sign. There's "it" something beautiful about a Union sign, when it is hung in the right place and will may you glory it if it has been a gold digger for you. We are sorry as an Association to have embarrassed you, but don't you think that according to your own statements that you have held jobs long enough, and that you need a rest. You need 12 years is a long time, and you have admitted that cutting hair for 25 cents is a prosperous business. Why don't you be a gentleman and let sport and choose one or the other, and let one of the unfortunate unemployed get a job. After all, we know of some places where they would not allow it, and of course some of our Association would ever dream of going down to Cheney's and tell them we could do your job cheaper than you. Also that we're crony to pay Mr. Hildebrand so much. If they did they would no longer be a member of our Association.



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
