**SEE BETTER TRADE FOR THE HOLIDAY**

**Warmer Weather Helps Retail Sales, Says Report on Business of Nation.**

New York, June 23.—(AP)—Dun and Bradstreet in its weekly trade review declared today there would be little regret in the passing of the second quarter and that evidence indicated the year's lows had been reached in many divisions of trade and industry.

"The passing of the second quarter, with its few weeks of weather restrictive influences heavily on most trade branches, and much of the advantage accrued during the first quarter was lost," it was stated.

"Warmer weather and preparation for the July Fourth holidays gave a strong impetus to consumer buying of sundries, confectionery and sales at many of the principal centers of distribution reached by the end of the month."

**June Sales**

"June sales show evidence of a larger total than was at first estimated. With seasonal weather emphasizing the necessity of covering requirements long postponed, retail sales for the week averaged 2 3/8 per cent ahead of the comparable 1934 for the week ending June 16.

The wholesale markets, the survey found, were larger than the previous week's total in most branches, and in many instances prices became firmer or give indication of advancing. Fall buying is marked by less caution than was comparatively little change in industrial operations for the week, but more intensiveness was evident, as schedules declined slowly in some divisions and advanced in others.

**Reasons For Increase**

There were several reasons for the increase in price in the Manchester market yesterday. The incoming of the strawberries from Cape Cod did not affect the price of the berries in this section as it is the main of the large buyers that the berries from the Manchester market are the chief. The remaining quantity of the loads being brought to Boston for sale in the Manchester market yesterday, Mr. Connelly was the largest buyer in the Manchester market yesterday and it was the high bid that he made for berries that jumped the average of the day before from \$2.07 to \$2.04 an average crate yesterday.

**Large Buyers**

Another large buyer yesterday was Lamo Brothers of Providence, New York, who bought over 10,000 crates at the market yesterday. The first National Stores bought over 10,000 crates at the market yesterday, although they were high buyers in the early weeks two years ago, last year and the opening of the market buyers from those cities at yesterday.

**Prices Increase**

It was also interesting to note yesterday that the farmers who were expecting a calling off in the prices that their berries would bring, were much delighted when they found that there had been 60 cents a crate increase in the averages at yesterday's market.
