



It has been estimated that hair of the adults in the United States have had Athlete's Foot, or have it at the present time. From this you will realize how widespread is the disorder.

Athlete's Foot is due to a fungus or microscopic plant. The name ring worm of the foot is commonly given to it, but this conveys the wrong impression, since many people infei from the name that it is due to a worm which burrows beneath the skin, when the true cause is a plant growth. In most cases it affects only the outer layers of skin and does not go very deep. While not a serious trouble, it compels attention because it affects so many people and ranks as one of the most common of all skin disorders, being found principally among young adults.
