ETHIOPIA IS PREPARING FOR ITALY'S FIRST ACT

Widespread Military Orders Issued; Capital Believes War Is Almost Inevitable; England Speeds Up Moves for Peace.

Addis Ababa, July 15.—(AP)—Widespread military preparations for the general mobilization order which is believed imminent were reported throughout Ethiopia today, following Emperor Haile Selassie's speech in which he warned his subjects that it was better to die free than to live as slaves.

Specific details of the military step were not available in the capital, but a new note of determination was seen in the attitude of the general public. Following the Emperor's intimation that war with Italy was almost inevitable.

Fourteen thousand personnel already have joined the new patriotic movement. Amos Poole, a British "Love of Country" adherent last night's big meeting of former soldiers in Addis Ababa.

Unconfirmed reports of a new Italian ultimatum to Ethiopia were received but the foreign ministry was unable to gain a certified report.
