





## OCCUPIED HOUSE 66 YEARS: NOW EJECTED

Middle Turnpike East, widow of Elihu Thompson, veteran of the Civil War, has been ordered out of her home near the Glastonbury Knitting Company plant after living there for 66 years. At the present time Mrs. Thompson and her daughter and son-in-law have not located a house, having been stunned by the proceedings initiated by Victor Hedeen of Hollister street, new owner of the property, who plans to use the house for a showroom for his antique furniture trade.

In Same House 92 Years.

For nearly a century—92 years to be exact—the Thompson family has lived in the house at the east end of the Glastonbury Knitting Company plant. The old house dates back to 1736 and was built by a member of the Cone family and is one of but three houses now standing shown on the earliest maps of Manchester Green. It is contemporaneous with the old Woodbridge Tavern, where it is said General George Washington stopped on one of his trips through Manchester to Cambridge, headquarters of the Continental Army.




