

Federalists Downed Pole But Bay State Episode Starts Ardent Association.

Hebron, Aug. 17 — (Special) Former Representative Ames W. Sisson has returned from spending rain, Mass., where he attended a gathering of the Catamount Hill Association, all of the members of which are descendants of the mak-ers of the first United States flag, as nearly as can be ascertained, evraised and floated over a scholbor nearly as can be ascertained, ever raised and floated over a scholhouse in the entire country.

The flag was raised in May, 1812, the idea being conceived by Amasa Shippee, a prominent "Democratic Republican" of the community, who wished to express his loyalty and that of the other clizzens in connection with the approaching War of 1812. The flag was made under difficulties, as none of the women who were interested in fashloning it had ever seen a United States flag.

Mr. Shippee, however, was an active member of the state militia and had often trained under the flag's folds. He got out his compass and square and marked out the pattern for the stars, of which there were only 18 at that time, and showed the women how to arrange the stripes. The flag was made in the kitchen of his home. His wife Rhoda, furnished the white, and Lois, wife of Reud the white, and Lois, wife of Reu-ben Shippee, furnished the blue. ben Shippee, furnished the blue. Both were spun and woven on hand looms, and the blue was dyed with home made dye. The blue had at first been made into an apron, but was cut over for the flag. Where the red came from was not handed down to posterity. Other women who had a hand in making the flag were Mrs. Sophia Willis and Mrs. Stephen Hale.
