Health and Diet Advice
 By DR. FRANK MCCOY.

In my article Saturday, I discussed some of the causes of headache and promised to explain to you today, how to overcome headache. The first part of the treatment must be directed toward determining the cause of the ache. This can only be accomplished by means of a thorough examination, and during the study of the case, special attention should be given to the gastro-intestinal tract, which refers to the stomach and intestines. The eyes should be tested to determine whether the ache is not brought on by eyestrain resulting from an uncorrected visual defect. It is very important that the kidneys be studied, and a test of the kidney's elimination is necessary. An examination of the nose and throat must also be included, and the patient should be instructed regarding sinus infection.

If the patient gives a history of recurring attacks of biliousness, a differential diagnosis can only be arrived at through considering the diet and the way it is doing its work.

I find it necessary to make some inquiry into the emotional life of the patient. Often a headache which seems to arise from an obscure cause will be satisfactorily explained through the discovery of an emotional situation which he does not know how to solve, and the extreme tension of the struggle will take the form of a distressing headache. If the physical examination discloses no satisfactory cause for the persistent headache, the true cause will usually be found in the emotional make-up of the individual. In such cases, psycho-therapy will provide amazing relief from the headache, which will disappear as soon as the patient is helped with his problem.

When a headache is a prominent feature, it is always safe to make a determined effort to build up the general health in every way possible. The systemic treatment should be directed toward improving the general health as a whole. The patient must be taught to eat correctly, to exercise enough, to relax more thoroughly, and to maintain a regular sleep schedule. One of the most important points to be secured is adequate intestinal elimination each day. If the elimination is sluggish, the system must be re-taught to function normally. Certainly, constipation is one of the most common causes of headache, and with the relief of the one condition, the other follows automatically.

As to the treatment to be used during the actual attack of headache, most cases of this type will be satisfactorily relieved by having the patient take an emetic and then lie down in a darkened room. A simple and effective for the relief of headache is to wrap a handkerchief around the forehead in hot water for ten or fifteen minutes. This will bring a better circulation of blood to the feet, and if the cause of the headache has been a headache of the brain, will be very satisfactory relief.

Inasmuch as most headaches are of toxic origin, the use of the fast is generally advisable, and it is surprising how often the fast will relieve the ache. The first day of the patient may seem to have a slight headache, but as the body becomes cleaner, the ache will then disappear.
