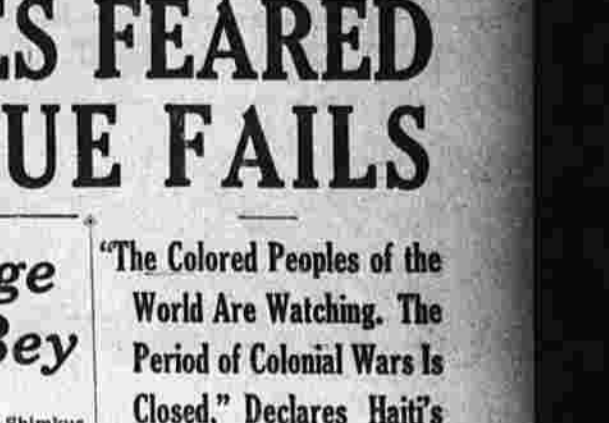

### The Early History Of Manchester

The late Joseph Olcott Goodwin, a direct descendant of Olaus Goodwin, who came from Boston through the wilderness to the Connecticut River in 1635, was born in 1874 until the year of his death, 1923—a period of 49 years. This hobby was published "The History of East Hartford" in 1875. When he entered the office of a town clerk, his curiosity and quest for accurate records and manuscripts prompted him to search every book and record pertaining to this valuable material. After years of searching he accumulated many papers and books that were yellowed with age. These papers, mostly poetry, genealogy and information concerning past events, which otherwise would have been lost or destroyed.

When Matthias Spies gathered the material into a book, he called it "The History of East Hartford" and it was published in 1875. Goodwin was also acquainted with a few elderly persons who lived during the American Revolution and with others who recalled what they had heard from their grandfathers about the "good old days." It is interesting to note that in the early part of this section, especially of East Hartford and Manchester which were united in 1854, the names of the old papers of the early days are mentioned.
