BRITISH LABOR PARTY FACING CRISIS ON 'WAR' Many Propose That League Should Invoke Military Measures To Prevent Conflict; Leaders Against It.

London, Sept. 19.—(AP)—The question of whether the League of Nations should invoke military measures to prevent war in Africa resulted today in a crisis in the ranks of Great Britain's Labor Party.

Chairman of the government's strongest opposition group in London for what was described officially as a "war emergency committee."

The immediate question to be decided by the labor executive was whether the party should support its Parliamentary forces for four years—George Lansbury and Lord Ponsonby in the House of Commons and Lord Ponsonby in the House of Lords—must stay down to make way for new blood.

Both Lansbury and Lord Ponsonby are avowed pacifists of long standing and have maintained a preference for old-fashioned political methods.

Lansbury announced his resignation as Labor leader in the House of Commons yesterday and Lansbury offered to quit his post in Commons.

Some of the party's most prominent members have announced their intention since the Trades Union Congress party made a joint declaration in favor of using all necessary means provided by the League of Nations Covenant.

In view of a campaign launched by the Socialist League against Lansbury's better drawn into any "war emergency committee."

Eventual replacement of Lansbury by some likely candidate for the party was predicted Friday.
