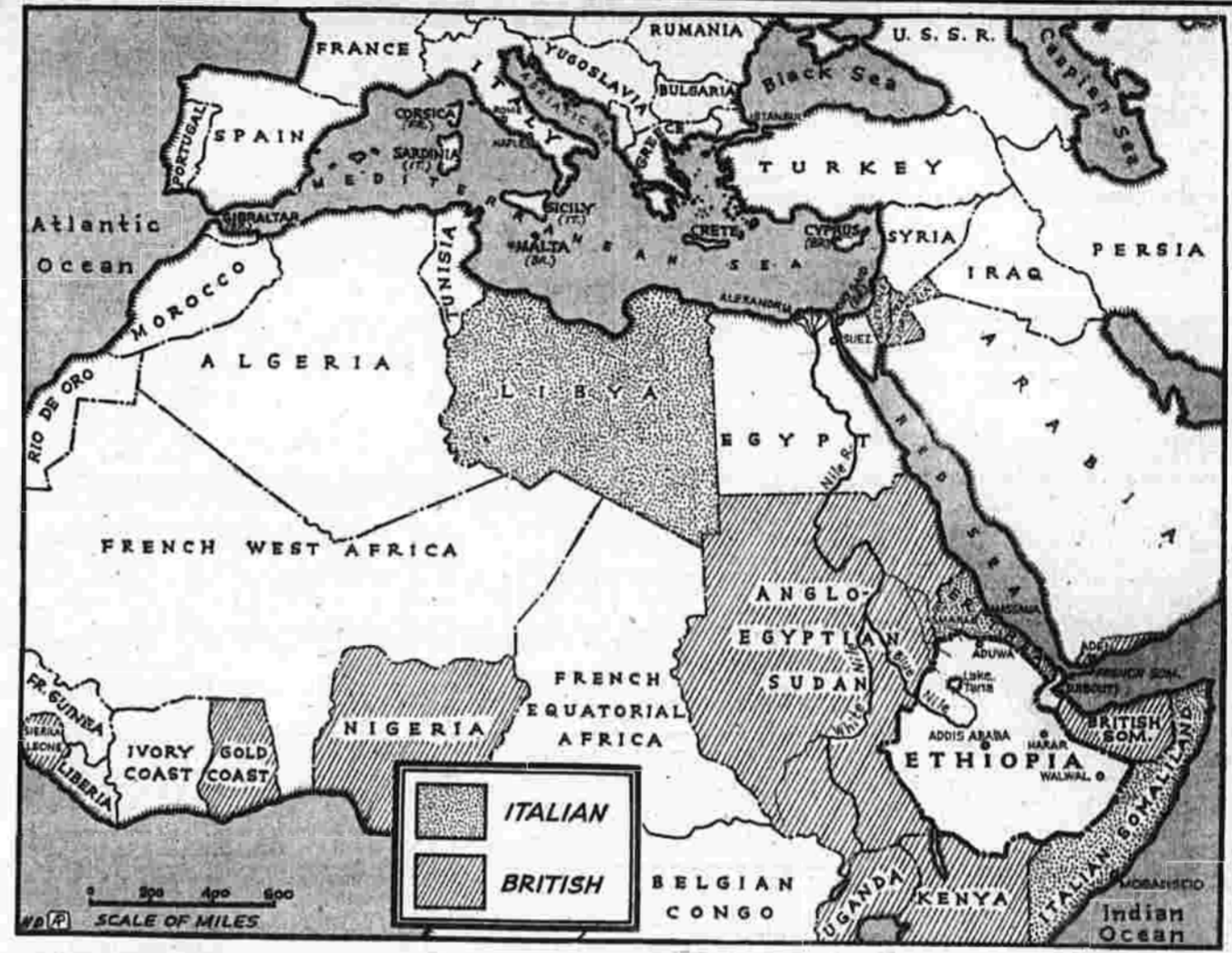

Macdonald Adds Ten Projects To Dozen Already Announced This Month.
Ten new highway projects, calling for the improvement of nearly 15 miles of road surface, the building of new bridges, and drainage work, were announced today by Highway Commissioner John A. Macdonald for a contract letting on October 7. These new jobs bring the number of projects announced by the commissioner during the month of September to a total of 22.

NECKWEAR PLANT IN UNION TROUBLE

Factory in Bayonne, N. J., to Try to Move to Manchester, Newspaper Says.

Louis Fuchs, manager of the United Neckwear Makers Union with headquarters at 7 East 16th street, New York city, has been in Manchester looking into the situation that exists in recently opened Manchester Neckwear factory.

His visit to Manchester was prompted by the story that appeared in the press concerning the payment of wages in Manchester and Bayonne, N. J., and called to see Nathan Hockman and the local factory.

On Monday afternoon, Sept. 16, he returned to New York city for a short sentence for introduction. On Friday in the Brooklyn City Court, Judge S. Erik sentenced Cahill to jail for 30 days for introducing a strike in the factory.

On the Bayonne Times of September 17, the following is reprinted: "Nathan Hockman, president of Hockman & Kramer, Inc., neckwear factory located at 165 Avenue B, declared this forenoon that the strike effort by the union organizers to bring about a strike, their attempt thus far has been fruitless."
