

Challenged by the greatest annual accident death roll in the nation's history, 21,000 Red Cross volunteer instructors taught water safety and first aid methods to 383,000 men, women and children, in the United States during the year past, Dr. R. P. Knapp, chairman of the Manchester Chapter, disclosed today.

"This vast army of life saving examiners and first aid instructors, which 25 years ago numbered exactly two—one swimming teacher and one doctor teaching first aid in the Pennsylvania mining section—was spurred on in its humane task by the picture of 101,000 broken, mangled bodies—human victims of 1934's ignoble record—and the equally horrifying portrait of 300,000 others, victims of these same accidents, who are destined to go through life persuctimes of these same accidents, who are destined to go through life permanently crippled.

"Recognizing in this wholesale staughter of human lives a challenge that must be met by greatly increased activity in the field of first aid and life saving the Red Cross is developing a program which is expected to carry the lesson of accident prevention and emergency care into every home and school in the country." Dr. Knapp continued.

"Already these simple but effective methods of aiding an injured person and the equally simple principles of water safety have been taught to a million and a half persons in the United States by the Red Cross," he said.

"Recruited from every walk of life, factories, homes, police and fire factories, homes, police and a host of other organizations, these people know how to help themselves and their neighbors in case of accident," the Chapter Chairman configured.
