Rome, Oct. 15.—(AP)—Frenz from an interview with Premier Mussolini, former Senator Henry Allen of Kansas said today that the Italian premier had no intention of avoiding a European conflict.

"Apparently he regards the danger as not a domestic problem, but as far as consolidation of his power as the Italian people is concerned."

"He does not feel that he does not hope for avoidance of a European war, but he does not believe that he will not leave the League of Nations unless military sanctions are imposed."

Emilie took her first steps a few days before she came out of her cot, and she is now walking over- and- over fashion when she wants to get anywhere in a hurry. She and Cecile and Annette all walk with the nurse's help. Left to them, they scoot up and down the nursery or around their play pens on all fours.

Dr. Franz Pieper, director of the excavations, announced today.

Dr. Pieper, who was directing the research work, said the remains of 24 individuals of this primitive human type hitherto unearthed among fossil remains are skulls for the most part, leading to the belief that the "Peking Man" was a head hunter and cannibal who preyed on others of his kind.

The studies show, researchers declare, that the "Sinanthropus" the earliest true man yet discovered, was related to the modern Mongolian.
