Do Not Know How It Will Be Given—May Use Fire Alarm.

Company K and the Howland Company of this town are anticipating orders for mobilization of the two local units soon from the General Post Office, First Corps Commander in Boston. Officers of the company do not know in what manner the mobilization will be held or whether the national guard assembly signal will be blown on the local fire alarm system.

There are two ways of assembling the men of the units, by selecting several "key" men who are notified by the officers immediately upon receipt of the order to mobilize, who in turn telephone or notify the other members of the company, or sound the National guard signal on the fire alarm system.

The last general corps mobilization was held about five years ago at which time the local companies were mobilized at the armory in the space of two hours.

BRITISH MARINES QUELL RIOTS IN WEST INDIES
