





TO SELL SUN GLASSES

Dealers in Optical Goods Warned They Must Get Right from Commission.

Establishments that offer for sale at retail optical merchandise and kindred products, such as sun glasses, binoculars, goggles, field glasses, magnifiers, microscopes, etc., must have retail permits, to be secured upon application to the Commission of Opticians under Public Acts of 1935, Chapter 293.

Secretary of the Commission, H. W. Hoskins, has mailed over 3,000 application blanks to establishments that possibly offer for sale such merchandise.

The Commission has been flooded with requests for retail permits as the result of this mailing. The Commission warns that establishments offering for sale at retail the foregoing merchandise that have not yet applied for a retail permit should do so immediately, as this law is now in effect.

Any person, firm or corporation owning, managing or conducting any store or place of business not holding an Optical Pernit at this time where such optical merchandise is sold, is subject to a mandatory fine of not more than \$200.00, or imprisonment of six months, or both.


