





While all the counts in the 365 communities in England and Wales which balloted were not yet complete, the returns showed a number of Labor losses. With decisions rendered in 101 out of the total number of towns where Council scats were at stake, Conservative gains numbered 32 and Labor defeats 24.

Strangely enough, the Labor Party's biggest success occurred in Oxford, home of Great Britain's most aristocratic university, where the party chalked up four wins. Industrial Areas Industrial Areas Industrial areas gave socialistiabor candidates set-backs. The same centers, notably Birmingham, Liverpool, Leeds and Manchester, voted for the Conservatives.

Ohe-third of the town councils was elected in each community. In the Parliamentary field a last rush of candidates complete the lists before Monday's nominations was expected. The latest-estimates showed 1,305 candidates contesting for 615 seats in the House of Commons. Of these 579 are government candidates and 726 those of various opposition parties.

Twenty-two government candidates will have no opposition.


