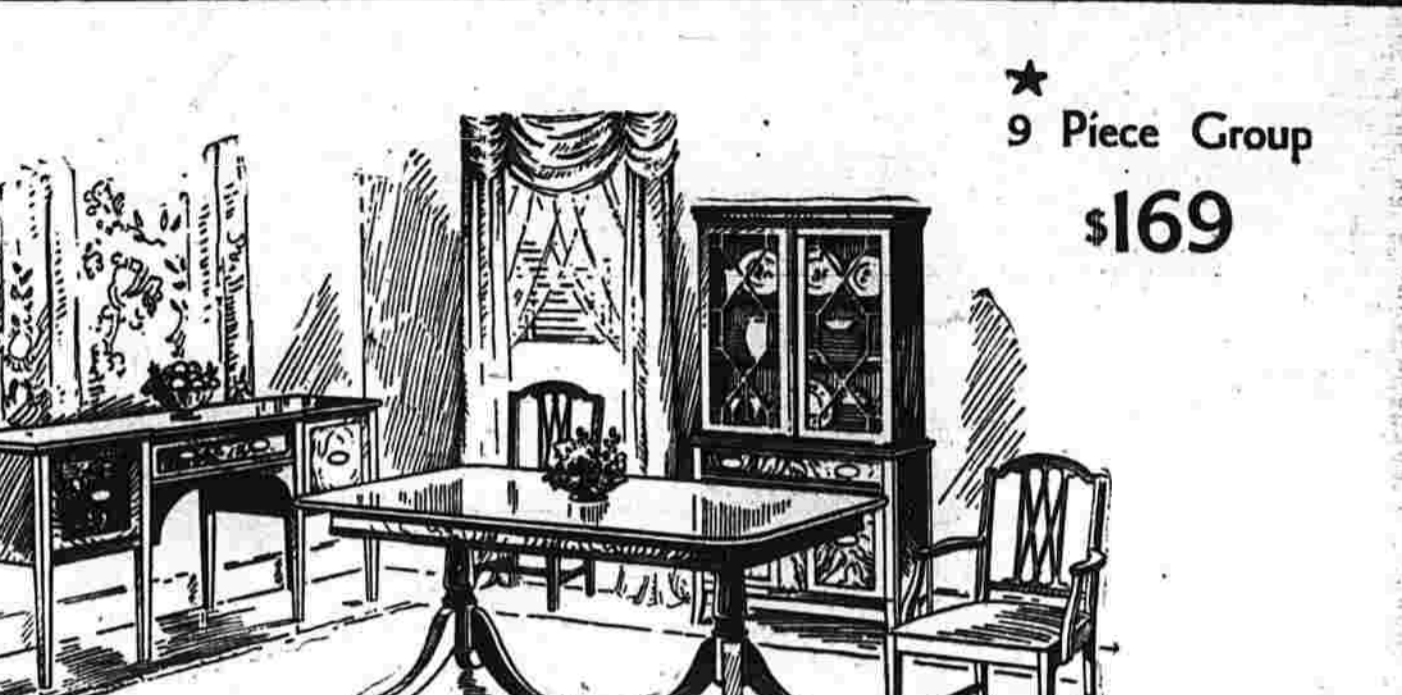

CHRISTMAS MAILINGS SCHEDULES NAMED

Postmaster Crocker Gets Orders That All Mail Must Be Delivered Before Christmas.

Instructions have been received by Postmaster Frank R. Crocker relative to the Christmas mail and mailing dates for foreign countries.

The order states that all Christmas mail shall be delivered by midnight, Tuesday, December 24, and that all postal employees who can be spared, shall have the opportunity to spend Christmas Day with their families.

There will be no city delivery in Manchester, except delivery of gift packages, rural delivery or window packages, on Christmas Day. It is not intended that delivery of gift parcels shall prevent postal employees from having the day off, as such temporary employees and such of the classified force who may volunteer for the extra service, may be used for such service.

Special delivery and portable mail shall be handled as usual, upon receipt and limited collections for postage stamps, on Christmas day. Special delivery mail, however, shall not be delivered on Christmas Day.

Mail intended to be received by Christmas in Great Britain, including England, Scotland, Northern France, Italy, Poland, Switzerland and Sweden will close in New York on December 14. Christmas mail dropped to third place in the Valley Forge Express train advanced into sixth place last night when their team won high single with a score of 12 points.

Mail intended for Brazil will close Dec. 7. Argentina, Nov. 30; Panama and Canal Zone, Dec. 7 and Costa Rica, Nov. 28. Postmaster Crocker announced today.

It was announced that U. S. foreign Air Mail Route, No. 14, the United States to Hawaii from San Francisco, Honolulu, Canton, China, Philippines; Manila to Canton, China, and return has been instituted with air mail rates combined. United States to Hawaii, 25 cents per one-half ounce; United States to the Philippines, 70 cents per one-half ounce.

Westbound planes will leave San Francisco Nov. 8 and 22 for Honolulu and returning will leave Manila on Nov. 18 and Dec. 2. The first two trips will not include the China station. A special route air mail stamp commemorating the institution of the new route has been printed in 25 cent denominations.
