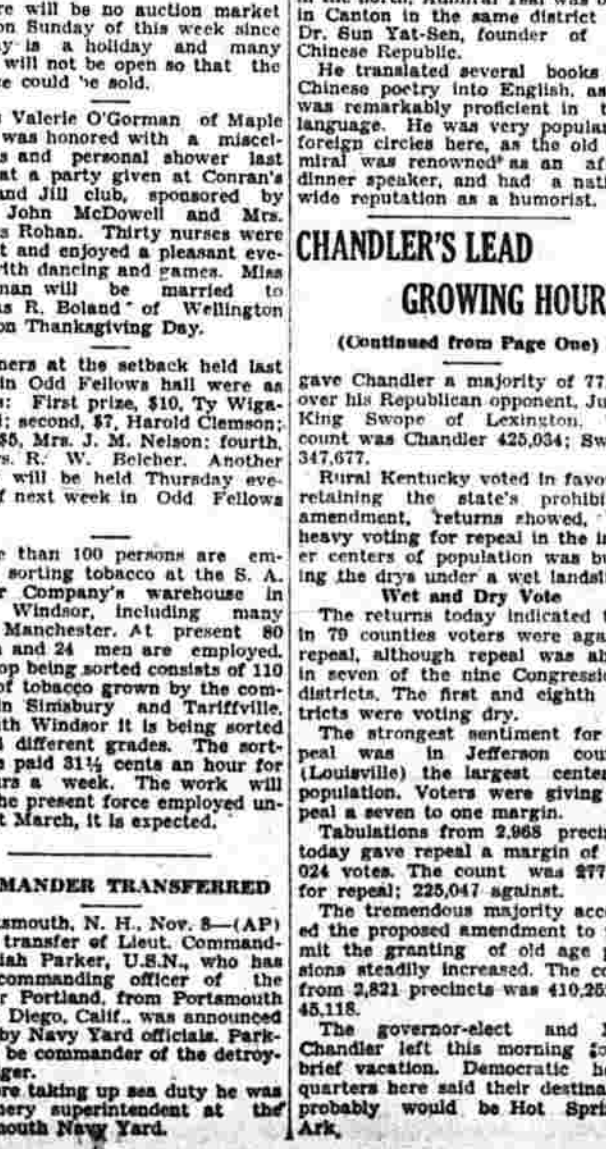

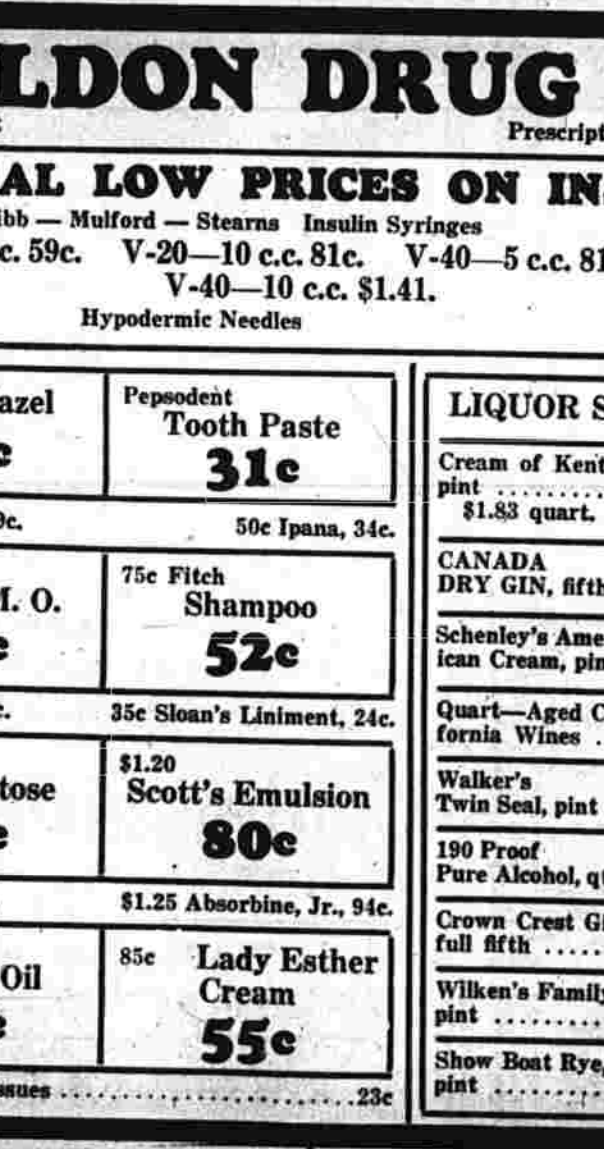

Secretary Hull, speaking for President Roosevelt, announced by radio night before last that the administration would ask Congress for "more elastic" neutrality act than the one hastily adopted in the closing hours of the last session. What the President wants is an act that will enable this country to co-operate with other countries to prevent or lessen the course of war," according to Mr. Hull. What he really wants is for Congress to turn over the problem of foreign relations, with respect to leading or prospective war, to the chief executive—to put the question of keeping free from war entanglements, or getting inextricably mixed up in them, in the hands of one man. The Neutrality Act may be new; indeed there is no question about its being so. But the extraordinary thing about it, in view of it being a neutrality act, is that the President is free for more power over peace or war, is that he has interpreted it in the narrowest possible sense and has failed utterly to take full advantage of the limited power it gives to him.

The act authorizes the President, in the event of war between other nations, to prohibit the export of arms, ammunition and implements of war, and it leaves the definition of these things to the executive. Mr. Roosevelt saw fit to interpret it in such a way that it would be illegal to sell an arm or war to a belligerent but legal and permissible to sell him a truck and the plates with which to armor it; an offense to ship him machine guns and rifles, all right to supply him with cotton and nitrate and sulphuric acid; a violation of the law to provide him with gun barrels but perfectly legal to send shipments of steel to his gun factories and cargoes of scrap to his smelters.

He saw fit to adopt a secondary and specific definition of the term "implement" instead of the more inclusive primary definition—"that which fills or supplies a want." Anything that can contribute to the making of war is an implement of war. But Mr. Roosevelt was very careful indeed not to include cotton, petroleum products, copper and other war metals, including steel, in the list of embargoed items—and of course Mr. Ford's shipments of thousands of motor trucks and General Motors' exports of hundreds, to the East African war zone were not to be interfered with.

It, at the crucial moment, the war outbreak had been met with a declaration of an all-around embargo with teeth, entirely possible under the Neutrality Act, we should not now be in the very delicate position in which we have been placed by a half-hearted, part-way administration of that law. Declaring an embargo of all goods and products convertible to the purpose of war, applied equally to both parties to the controversy at the outset, in the United States would have been a position that no one, not even if it had been a possibly critical, but having failed to do this, we used the Neutrality Act only as the basis for an embargo on a few items of small relative consequence, we are now in the dilemma of having to continue to sell war supplies to Italy, thereby defeating or seriously hampering the sanctions of the League of Nations, or of lagging along at the heels of the League, which has declared an embargo of all goods and products convertible to the purpose of war, and must help Italy to defy the League and to beat Ethiopia, or we must fall in with the League in its condemnation of the Italians as aggressors and in its efforts to starve her into abandoning the war. The former horn of the dilemma is one to turn

the stomach. The latter is one which lands us squarely in the midst of those slimy European alliances of which the American people want no more, ever.

And we are in this predicament because we had a previous pick, somewhat enough to do the right thing, but that previous Congress had given him the authority.

And now, if you please, the same President whose incapacity to deal with this relatively simple problem has gotten us into a most distressing situation, asks Congress to give him practically unlimited power to handle those foreign relations matters all by himself.

No thanks, Mr. Roosevelt. If you were given the power you want and if you didn't know how to get us into a World War by 1937 through your squirming and shifting and pushing half way, then backing up—the way you have done everything else so far and the way you have done with the present Neutrality Act—then it would be solely because this country is sneered with luck. We wouldn't give the authority you ask to George Washington, or to Abraham Lincoln, if they were back here today. Which means, about a hundred times over, that we won't give it to you.

HOLDING COMPANIES

It is not, perhaps, surprising that a federal judge who has been a conservative in his appointment at the hands of a very conservative President, Mr. Coolidge, should be convinced that the 1935 Holding Company Act is invalid. It is a little surprising, however, that even such a judge can find nowhere in that long, complicated but on the whole carefully drawn instrument a single shred of merit.

There are a good many good lawyers in the United States Congress. There are a number who are really Constitutional authorities, or at least recognized as such. There never was a bill before House or Senate which drew hotter fire than the Holding Company measure. The debate over it in both Houses was extended and closely watched by the public. 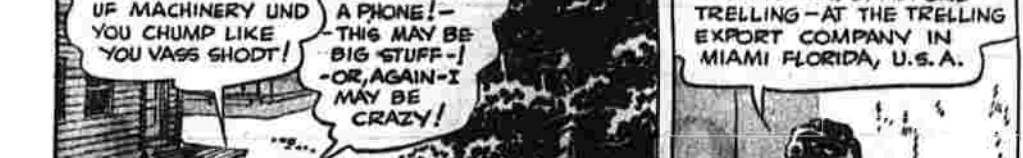

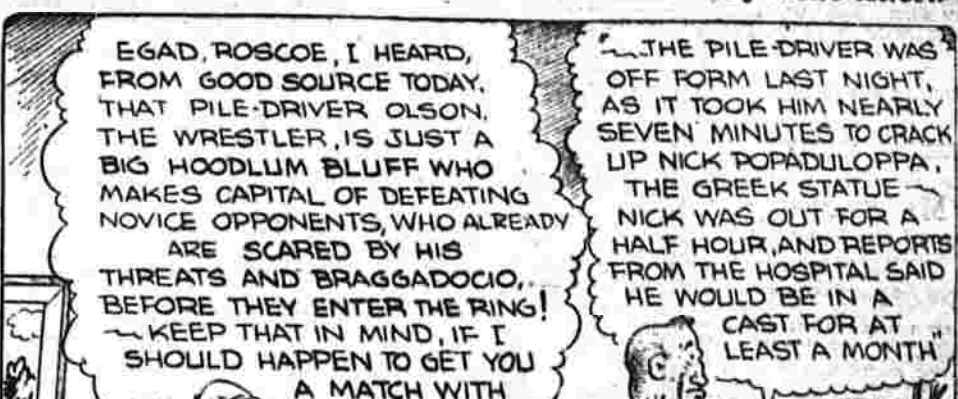
