# BEHIND THE SCENES IN WASHINGTON

The Hersid Washington Correspondent.

Washington, Nov. 12.—There's some talk in responsible quarters of filing anti-trust law suits against groups alleged to have joined in raising the price of bread.

Thus far it's only talk. But evidence has been assembled and is being studied to determine what ground there may be for action.

The anti-trust law policy of the administration is so vague, especially since collapse of the NRA and during current faltering attempts to establish voluntary codes, that no one is predicting whether or not action will be taken.

It is conceded that some bread price prosecutions might be a smart political move. Much of the price-fixing in bread has affected only bread sold in intrastate commerce, but some of the higher-priced bread is regularly shipped sacross state lines.

Officials concerned have been reading with interest a recent except from the Food Field Reporter, trade publication of Philadelphia had-demanded an increase of 31's per cent in the wholesale price of bread so some bakers might pay four bills long overdue. The story added:
