### VATICAN ATTEMPTS TO HALT SANCTIONS

Rome Reports That Pope Is Using Every Effort to Postpone League's Action Against Italy.

Expect 31 Million to Vote Today--Predict Conservatives Will Win.

LONDON, Nov. 14. (AP)--Thirty-one million voters hold the balance of power today in the election of the House of Commons. The Vatican is reported to be making a supreme effort to have application of sanctions against Italy postponed.

Usually well-informed ecclesiastical sources said the Holy Father was still hopeful that League of Nations powers would delay imposition of trade bans on Italy for its warfare against Ethiopia, in the interest of world peace.

Some sources say significance in Premier Mussolini's note this week to the League states agreement to sanctions, in which he is invited by implication to reconsider their collective action.

Each nation of the League of Nations has a representative in the House of Commons. The seventh general election since the World War was expected in political quarters to give Prime Minister Stanley Baldwin's Conservative party a majority of approximately 100 seats in the House of Commons.

As the electorate chose the 615 members of the Lower House of Parliament after a noisy campaign, political observers forecast two possible results:

1. The labor representation may be increased through a reduction of the conservative majority, largely in the last Parliament.

2. Some outstanding candidates, including party leaders who have not been elected in the past, may be relegated to private life after the ballots are counted.

Outstanding among the candidates whose position is considered dangerous for the government is Ramsay MacDonald, present Lord President of the Council. He was accused of deserting the Labor party in 1931 when it was a leader, when the coalition government was formed.

Withouts Hopes.

In the meantime, Italy withheld reprisals until the punitive measures actually were imposed. This was interpreted by circles as indicating it does still thought the economic sanctions might not be applied and that it would be possible to arrange for a truce.

Pope Pius was said by informed church circles to have remained only three days to arrange postponement of the penalties, but to be confident nevertheless of presenting the Vatican views to Premier Pierre Laval of France.

The pontiff also has many influential agents among his representatives in the League of Nations. It was said undoubtedly have been permitted to plead the cause of peace.

Ecclesiastical sources said it was the Vatican's belief that the League of Nations' economic sanctions not only would spare the world great economic disaster but also would increase Italy's prestige and aid her efforts to bring about settlement of the Italian-Ethiopian war.

Some sources also said that the League of Nations' economic sanctions would have been permitted to plead the cause of peace.
