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### TOWN CAN SET UP BOARD OF FINANCE

#### General Enabling Act Already On Statute Books, It Is Pointed Out.

Manchester, can set up a Board of Finance without waiting for the next session of the General Assembly, it has been pointed out to the Herald.

General enabling act adopted by the legislature in 1918 specifies that "any town, at a town meeting called for the purpose, may, by a resolution, provide for the establishment of a Board of Finance and prescribe the terms of office of its members and its powers and duties."

The duties of a Board of Finance adopted by Manchester under the act of March 1920, its functions were considerably curtailed as sections of the town charter specifically designate to the selectmen or other officers, some of the functions which normally would be performed by the board.

Such a board under the enabling act would be composed of five electors and taxpayers who shall hold office for one year. The selectmen will be clerk of the board.

A Board of Finance, set-up under the statute, would not recommend a budget to the selectmen, but would recommend a budget to be adopted by the selectmen as they see fit.

Members of such a Board of Finance would be elected at the next following annual town meeting after the next two years after its adoption.

A Board of Finance set-up by an amendment to the town charter would probably assure it of greater life.

A chartered board would likely have the power to adopt a budget and to levy taxes without the consent of a town meeting.

It has been suggested that if a Board of Finance is adopted by Manchester that it might be desirable that the board would have final say on the appropriation for education, doing the financial work for the town.

## CITY INDEBTEDNESS REDUCED BY \$15,000

Rockville, Nov. 22.—The City Treasurer has completed his report and the net indebtedness of the City at the close of the fiscal year ending November 15 is \$20,709.50. During the past year the City's net indebtedness was reduced \$15,000 and during the two years of Mayor George Scheta's administration the indebtedness was reduced about \$28,000.

During the past 15 years, the City has reduced its indebtedness from nearly \$140,000 as in 1920 the net indebtedness was \$139,009.46.

The close of the year of the City's bonded indebtedness was \$26,000 for 4 per cent sewer bonds which were being reduced \$200 annually, but there is \$184,232 in the sinking fund and \$100,000 in cash on hand which makes the net indebtedness \$20,709.50.

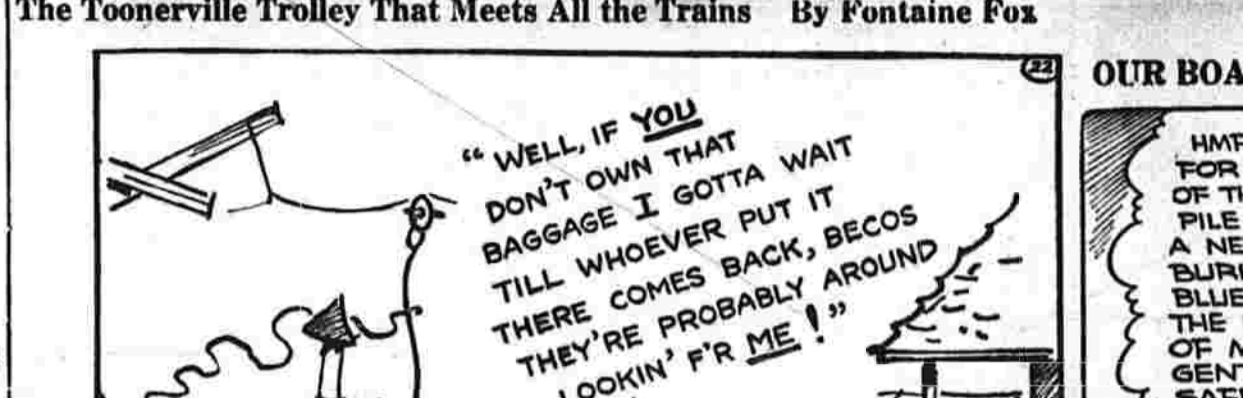
