# "APPROPRIATION PEAK IS PASSED" ROOSEVELT

From Now On Nation Can Look Forward to a Decreasing Deficit, President Tells Georgia Audience.

Atlanta, Ga., Nov. 29.—(AP)—President Roosevelt declared today the government has passed the "peak" of appropriation, and announced coincidentally the substantial achievement of the administration employment goal.

"We can look forward with assurance to a decreasing deficit," Mr. Roosevelt told a vast throng of Georgians at the "Homecoming Day" in his honor.

Repeating determination to end the debt, Mr. Roosevelt announced that \$125,000,000 had been taken out of red-ink rolls and were at work on last Wednesday.

Orders already have been issued, he added, for the remainder of the year. 500,000 employable to go to work.

Besides reviewing social and economic changes, the President commended financial conditions today and in "those Fool's Paradise years" before the crash.

"We were insolvent," he said; "today we are solvent.

"Your government says to you, 'You cannot borrow your way out of debt; but you can invest your way into a sounder future.'"

"I asked them what they thought the maximum National debt of the United States could rise to without serious danger to the National credit," he said.

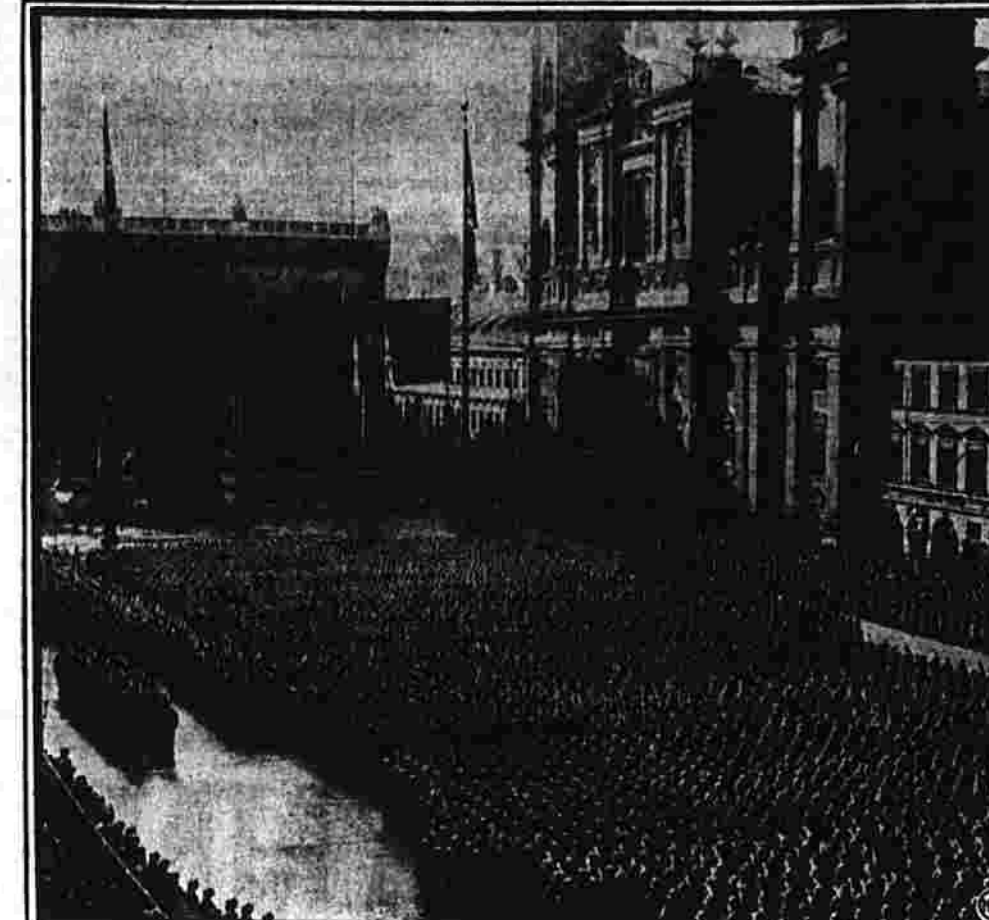
