TRADING IS DULL

New York, Dec. 4—(AP) — The Stock Market settled down in another testing area today after displaying uniform strength during early trading.

Profit taking and a certain amount of new short selling were the principal barriers at which the market balked and partly offset the encouragement given by selected buying among oils, some of the rails and a few industrials. Trading turned dull following a fast first hour.

The commodity trend was generally reactionary. Wheat lost fractions to more than a cent a bushed during the early trading in Chicago, and cotton slipped back for leases of around 25 to 50 cents a bale after getting off to a fairly good start. Corporate bonds were helped by further buying in U. S. Governments. Foreign exchanges were steady.

Steel, Bethlehem, General Motors, Auburn, General Electric, Sears Roebuck, American Telephone, Western Union, New York Central, Punnsylvania and Santa Fe. Stronger spots included Seaboard Oil, Amerada Corp., Phillips Petroleum, Standard Oil of New Jersey, Westinghouse, American Can, Johnsmanyille, and U. S. Smelting.

The financial community was alive with talk of an impending time in the price of crude oil in the mid-continent area, but a careful theck at the offices of most of the large concerns failed to substantiate the rumors.






