Alamander Hamilton, now Chief Justice Story, all of whom the court has decided to dismiss. That is the most disconcerting situation. One may well have some apprehension as to how the people will react to it.

There are a good many who will rejoice over the decision for its effect in blowing sky-high one of Mr. Roosevelt's pet fads—and that is the tariff on foreign goods.

It is, however, whose chief concern is with the well being of a hundred and thirty million Americans—not sixty million or sixty thousand—there will be the gravest apprehension that this decision will be the beginning of a series of similar decisions.

Now to get IT BACK. Over nine hundred million dollars have been paid in taxes to the United States on account of the processing taxes of the AAA, and now that act under which these transactions were conducted has been declared unconstitutional and compensation for the tax is to be paid.

How general these claims will be is a matter of guesswork, but on the face of things it looks as though there were a lot of money to be picked up by manufacturers and processors. To be sure it is impossible that in any but the most isolated cases the processors will be able to make their first attack.

It is an invasion of the rights of the states because, in the conviction of the court, it is a statutory plan to regulate and control agricultural production, a matter beyond the power of Congress to legislate.

It is highly probable that the time will come when the court will be sorely plagued by this part of the momentous triple-A ruling. If this decision had been predicted on the ground that it would be illegal because, while depending on the "general welfare" clause, it would be an invasion of the rights of the states because, in the conviction of the court, it is a statutory plan to regulate and control agricultural production, a matter beyond the power of Congress to legislate.

As to the immediate future of the country, as to any program for the restoration of national credit, accept it through voluntary action of great groups of individuals or through an utterly improbable concord between states for the adoption of uniform legislative enactments, the character of the opinion leaves us all in a state of the utmost uncertainty.
