POWER TO BALANCE DOLLAR EXTENDED

President Declares That Emergency That Prompted Measure Is Not Yet Ended

Washington, Jan. 10 (AP)—President Roosevelt today extended for another year his power to shift the dollar's gold content within a 10 per cent bracket and continued the effect of the \$2,000,000 stabilization fund.

Executive proclamation authorizing the power granted in the Gold Reserve Act, Mr. Roosevelt said the "emergency" prompting that measure's approval in 1934 "has not been terminated by international monetary agreement or otherwise but, on the contrary, continues and has been intensified in diverse respects by unsettled conditions in international commerce and finance and its foreign exchange."

The President said the \$2,000,000 fund was to be used in the protection of the dollar at home and abroad.

He authorized the secretary of the treasury, to deal in gold and foreign exchange and to issue such instruments of credit and securities as he might deem necessary for the purpose of stabilizing the exchange value of the dollar.
