

The Discovery carries two airplanes, fitted at the expense of the Australian government, several floats and a number of sledges which would be hauled by men, if necessary. The ship brought no dogs.

The vessel's hurried trip to Little America, made with the authorization of the British government, forced the Discovery to give up its own scientific survey in Antarctica, as the channels there are navigable for a month or two at most.

The Discovery, registered from the Faikland Islands in the southern Atlantic, was strengthened for navigation through ice. She is a steel schooner of about 1,000 tons.

The original Discovery, for which the Discovery II was named, is preserved as a relic on the East India docks in London. She was used by Captain Scott on his southern voyages.






