Answer: The stomach is not primarily an organ of digestion and the principal digestive processes take place in the small intestine. The stomach is regarded chiefly an organ in which food is stored before being released to the small intestine; however, the stomach does an important work in preparing protein, such as meat, for the next step in digestion, which step takes place in the intestinal tract. 


