Some idea of the large scale operation in "canned" speeches in a national election year may be had in the fact that in one such period senators and representatives paid \$65,266.19 to the public printer.

A member often will send out another member's speech on some subject he thinks will be of interest to his constituents. Not so long ago, records show that a member of the house from Pennsylvania used 30,000 coples of a Colorado representatives' speeches on the business side of the national government.

Senator Not Limited

During the present session, principally because of their desire to get through and go home as quickly as possible, leaders on both sides have privately agreed to throttle speechmaking as much as they can.

They intend wherever possible to prevent speeches being made in the open house and have them confined to the time when the house is in "committee of the whole and equally divided between the leaders are able to allot time just as they choose.




