



There are three principal forms of epilepsy. The most severe type is called Grand Mal and during seizures the patient may fall to the floor, the muscles jerking widely, the patient frothing at the mouth while unconscious. The average length of time for one of these seizures to continue is about ten minutes.

The second type of enilepsy is about ten minutes.


