HOTEL EMPLOYEES THREATEN STRIKE

Will Walk Out of 210 New York Establishments if Demands are Refused.

New York, Feb. 6.—(AP)—A strike of hotel and restaurant workers threatened today to disrupt New York's night life.

Hotel employes, who claimed they represented a union membership of 1,000 in 210 establishments, announced last night that they would walk out unless operators granted their demands for shorter hours and higher wages.

An announcement by Chris Houston, union president, that he had been authorized to call a strike at a moment's notice, recalled the second hotel strike of 1934.

THE OLD STORY
Pekin, Ill., is quite a bit smaller community than Manchester but it was putting on a show that commanded the attention of the nation as a novelty in the way of labor struggles and the conduct of the general strike was receiving a very considerable degree of tolerance among the audience, until some assassin shot a taxicab manager whose cab had been bringing food to strikers in a beleaguered district. Today, as a consequence of that crime, the Pekin strike no longer has any part of the sympathy of the country.

NOT "THE SPARK"
That the assassination of the Nazi leader and organizer in Switzerland, Dr. Goebbels, was a Jewish medical student named Frankfurter, might be the spark which set off the impending European war, is not a natural thought to flash into any mind upon receipt of the news. It is a thought which, however, would seem to preclude any likelihood of such an outcome of the tragedy. Nobody is directly involved in the political struggle, and unless there is some agitation among the Swiss leftists against the government permitting Goebbels to return to the continent, there is no evidence what so ever that the killing was in any way connected with the strike.
