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SPECIAL TOWN MEETING TO BE HELD SATURDAY

Voters to Be Asked to Approxiate \$4,500 to Audit Collector's and Town Treasurer's Books for Seven Years Past

A special town meeting in High school hall Saturday at 8 p. m. is appropriate for a seven years audit of the tax collector's and town treasurer's books, discharge the elective auditors and replace them with appointed certified public accountants, pass on ordinance regarding the sale of town streets, and accept three streets.

The election plan to ask for \$4,500 to finance the audit during the period from October 1, 1928 to October 7, 1935. The audit has been ordered by the state and the town will issue bonds for Tax Collector's books and Treasurer's books, which will be covered by the audit.

The ordinance will prohibit the sale of town streets to private individuals and will provide for the replacement of the elective auditors with appointed certified public accountants.
