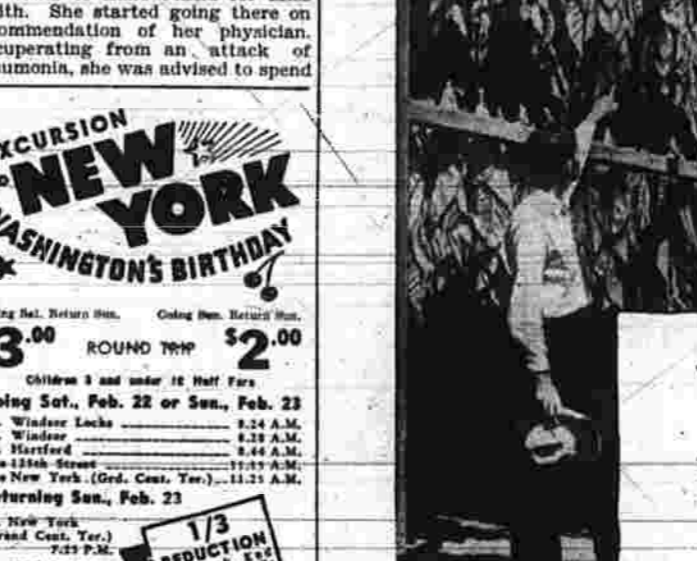

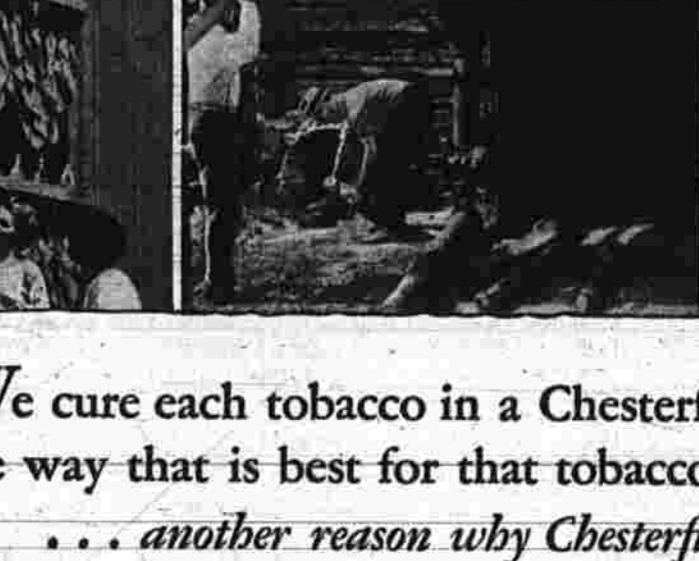

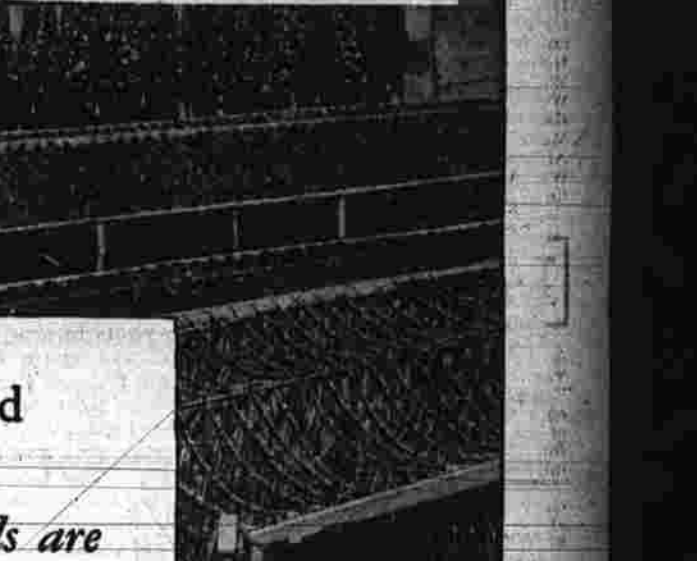

FACTORS, ISSUES OF THE CAMPAIGN

It Will Be Hard Year for Party Labels—New Deal the Issue.

Editor's Note: This is one of a series of the factors, issues and personalities in the 1936 Presidential campaign.

New York, Feb. 18.—(AP)—On March 4, 1936 here came a momentous change at Washington.

The New Deal of Franklin D. Roosevelt set forth a philosophy of National planning, a governmental program for social security, of the control of production, of government power operation as a "nationalized" or state-owned enterprise, and the Nation's exchanges of government-regulated relations between employer and employee.

The NRA and the AAA are gone; the Supreme Court has invoked the doctrine of state rights and has outlawed these New Deal activities.

However, the power struggle was amplified by TVA, emerged unscathed from its first Supreme Court battle. The court upheld the government in transmitting and selling power from Wilson Dam.

Despite the NRA and AAA defeat, the basic philosophy remained the same. Some have called this the philosophy of a "Modified Capitalism."

Whatever it can be called, the New Deal, by its very nature, has created divisions that sweep across party lines probably more than any political issue since Civil War days. New Deal and anti-New Deal—this terminology is used as much, if not more, than Democrat and Republican.

The opposition to the New Deal does not appear merely as a combination of natural Republican opposition and dissatisfied Democrats. It includes, for one thing, a coalition of certain industrial and business forces.

Such organizations as the United States Chamber of Commerce and the National Association of Manufacturers have joined in the opposition of New Deal activities. The Congress of the American Industry, converted last December by the "manufacturers" association, has done a platform of opposition to the New Deal.

The Liberty League

The factor of industrial and financial opposition to the New Deal is found, too, in the leadership of the American Liberty League.

The Liberty League, as a persistent critic of the New Deal as the Republican National committee, also provides an outlet for the activities of such anti-New Deal Democrats as Alfred E. Smith, former governor of New York; Joseph P. Kamp, of Massachusetts; J. P. Morgan, of New York; and John W. Davis, the 1924 Democratic Presidential candidate.

In the southern states, Governor Eugene Talmadge, of Georgia, has found the support of some of the leaders of the Louisiana organization built by the late Huey P. Long.

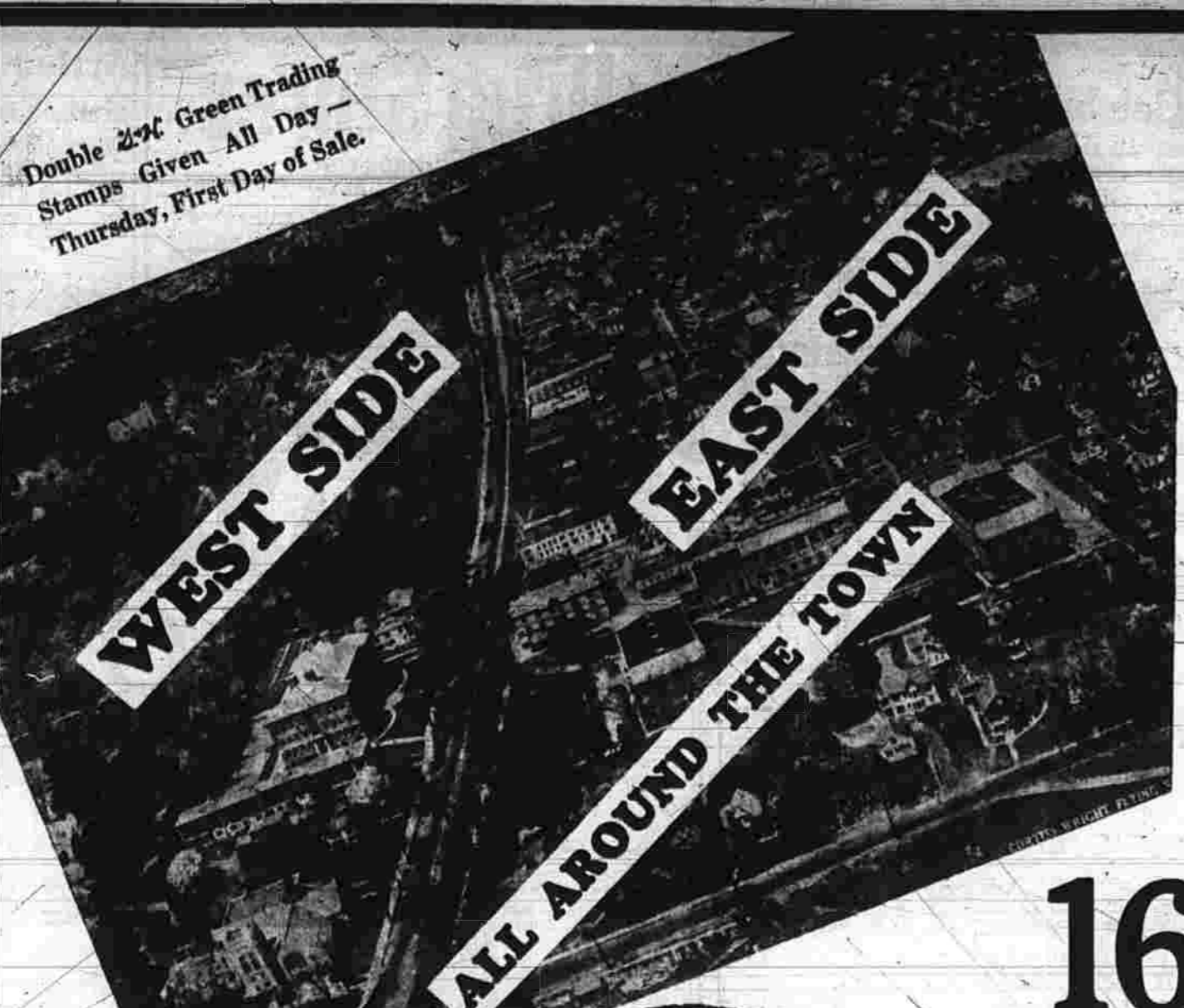

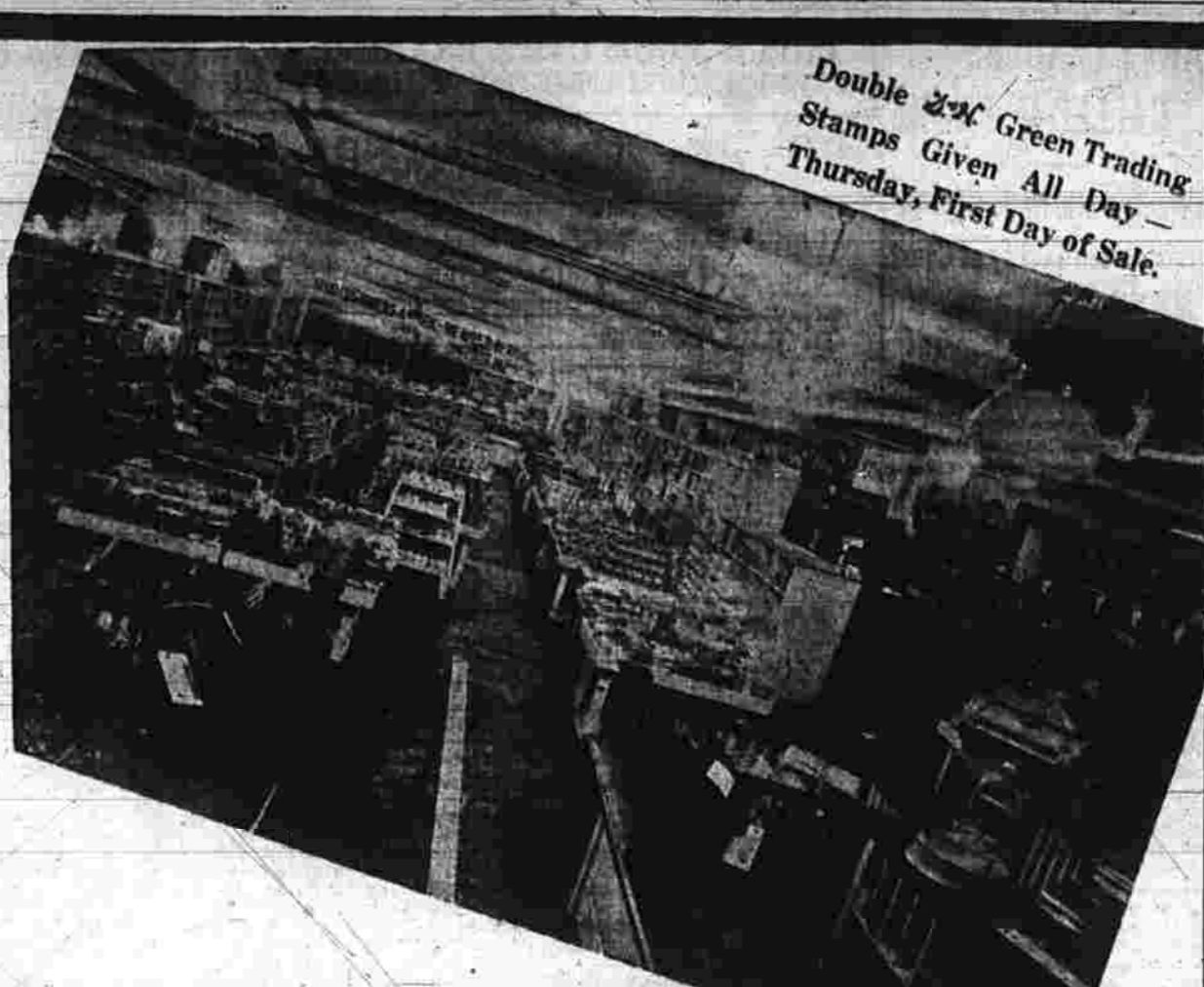
