COURT FIGHT STARTS ON SEIZURE OF GOLD

Government to Ask for Million in Taxes and Penalties in Hoarding Case.

New York, Feb. 21.—(AP) — The Federal government took issue today with the mysterious Josefowitz family, wealthy European financiers in the first stage of a court fight for possession of \$338,000 in hoarded gold and an additional \$1,000,000 in taxes and penalties.

A hearing was called in which the government was on the defensive, ordered to show cause why the Josefowitz's 10,000 \$20 gold pieces, seized Tuesday in a raid on a bank deposit vault, should not be returned.

The hoard, termed illegal by the government under President Roosevelt's gold seizure order of August 28, 1925, was uncovered by Secret Service men in a safe deposit box owned by Zelik Josefowitz, head of an enigmatic Lithuanian family.

Josefowitz claims that as he is an alien, the Presidential order may not be applied to him legally.



A good many millions of men fought in the World War, and some thousands of them seem to have written books about it.
But John Gibbons, English newspaperman who writes with such a light, deft touch, says that none of these innumerable books seems to describe the war in which he himself fought.




