



**ABOUT DISEASES** HELD GOOD SIGN

New, modern frankness with respect to the venereal diseases is a sign of great progress in the life of the Nation, since any attitude or any action which is directed toward real understanding of vital facts as they affect the welfare of the peo-ple is a giant strike toward a higher plane of public health, Dr. Alfred L. Burgdorf, acting director of the Bureau of Venereal Diseases of the State Department of Health, de-clared in the department's weekly broadcast today.

The more facts people know about the two diseases symbilis and eases is no less destructive than if a person knowingly watched his house burn down and purposely refused to inform the fire department. Any survey of national health, the doctor said, reveals the smoldering ruins of many damaged lives due to these diseases.

They have been burning steadily and leaving behind a trail of great suffering and pain, great economic waste, lost hours of employment, disrupted families, crippled men and women, couples rendered incapable of having children, blind, deaf, deformed or weak-minded off-springs,
